A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE KUPUNA CAREGIVERS PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that with 16.5 per cent
of Hawaii's population being sixty-five years or older, and with
projections of an increase to 19.4 per cent by 2020 and 23 per
cent by 2030, caring for Hawaii's kupuna is a high priority of
the legislature.

6 The legislature finds that currently there are 154,000 unpaid family caregivers in Hawaii who are taking care of their 7 8 parents, spouse, or other relatives who need extra care. Family 9 caregivers play a crucial role in the State's health care system 10 by providing long-term care to the elderly, all unpaid. It is 11 imperative to ensure that while caregivers are looking after 12 their loved ones, the caregivers must also take care of 13 themselves and have the necessary support and services to sustain their own health as well as the health of the family 14 15 member for whom they are caring.

16 To address this issue, the kupuna caregivers program was17 established on July 6, 2017, aiming to provide families in need

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of extra support services with additional resources to cover a 1 2 variety of services such as: adult day care, assisted 3 transportation, homemaker services, and many more important 4 services to qualified kupuna. The program ensures that 5 careqivers continue earning their own retirement benefits, which helps businesses retain experienced workers and provides peace 6 7 of mind that loved kupuna are well cared for while caregivers 8 remain in the workforce. This program allows caregivers who are 9 juggling their own employment with their caregiving 10 responsibilities to simultaneously take care of their kupuna and 11 themselves.

12 Since the establishment of the kupuna caregivers program, 13 the executive office on aging has reportedly received hundreds 14 of calls from Hawaii residents wishing to receive the benefits 15 of the program. While the creation of the program was an 16 important first step, the legislature believes that the program 17 requires additional second year funding to have the impact it 18 needs. With the high volume of residents showing interest in 19 the program, the current funding needs to be increased in order 20 to better serve the people of Hawaii.

21 The purpose of this Act is to:

7	SECTI	ION 2. Section 349-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
9	"(b)	The planning and administrative services division
10	shall engage in the following activities, including but not	
11	limited to:	
12	(1)	Preparation and submission of programs and budgets;
13	(2)	Preparation of an annual evaluation report on elder
14		programs for the governor and legislature $[+]$ which
15		shall include a section detailing outcomes of the
16		kupuna caregivers program, including but not limited
17		to, evaluation metrics; consolidated data of the
18		existing waiting list broken down by county; and
19		recommendations to support the implementation and
20		execution of the program;
21	(3)	Preparation of studies and analysis;



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1 (4)Maintenance of personnel records; Management of contracts and agreements entered into by 2 (5) the executive office on aging with public and private 3 vendors, consultants, and suppliers; 4 5 (6) Monitoring the purchase of service agreements with public and private agencies and rendering technical 6 7 assistance to elder program service providers; and (7) Establishment and maintenance of reimbursement systems 8 9 for services provided by agreement with federal, 10 state, and county agencies, as well as private 11 groups." There is appropriated out of the general 12 SECTION 3. 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for proper 14 implementation of the kupuna caregivers program; provided that 15 16 funds may only be used for kupuna careqiver program services

17 provided by care homes licensed under chapter 321, Hawaii

18 Revised Statutes.

19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the executive20 office on aging for the purposes of this Act.

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SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
