H.B. NO. **1961**

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that innovation is SECTION 1. critical to the success of Hawaii's economy. Business 2 accelerators support the growth of early-stage technology 3 companies in the State. Over the past five years, several 4 accelerators have been established in Hawaii. A few were formed 5 as public-private partnerships with the support of the Hawaii 6 7 strategic development corporation's launch akamai venture accelerator program. Hawaii's accelerators have received 8 national recognition for being outstanding programs and some 9 have received federal funding from the Small Business 10 Administration, Economic Development Administration, and the 11 Department of Defense. Additional accelerators are emerging in 12 13 the State.

Business accelerators are helping to build the critical mass that is required for innovative businesses to flourish in Hawaii. They provide business guidance and seed stage funding to startup companies that have a rapid development cycle, such



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as internet-based companies. The accelerators also complement 1 the tech incubator programs that provide support for companies 2 that require a longer time period to reach viability, such as 3 research-based and biotech companies. Further, the accelerators 4 are increasing the entrepreneurial activity of the State through 5 their showcases and hosted events centered on technology and 6 innovation, and are also strengthening the entrepreneurial 7 network between Hawaii, Asia, Silicon Valley, Hollywood, and 8 9 Washington, DC.

While business accelerators have been successful in 10 increasing the number of innovative companies in Hawaii, they 11 remain in their formative stages and have yet to achieve 12 profitability. This is in part because the equity stake that 13 the accelerators are holding in dozens of startup companies have 14 not yet matured to the point of self-sufficiency. 15 The accelerators have depended on financial assistance from the 16 State and county and federal governments in addition to 17 nonprofit sources to help pay for their operations. The 18 legislature strongly believes that the continuation of 19 accelerator programs is important to support business innovation 20 21 in this State.



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SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$\$ or so much
 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to support
 the continuation of business accelerator programs.

5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
6 technology development corporation for the purposes of this Act.
7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
