## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MASSAGE THERAPY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 452, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
3	and to read as follows:	
4	" <u>§</u> 45	2- Exemption from licensure. (a) A person shall be
5	exempt from licensure under this chapter if the person:	
6	(1)	Engages in the manipulation of the soft tissues of
7		only the hands, feet, or outer ears, including the
8		practice of reflexology and foot zone therapy;
9	(2)	Performs the services described under paragraph (1)
10		for clients who remain fully clothed;
11	(3)	Is certified by, and in good standing with, an
12		industry-recognized organization that represents
13		practitioners who perform the services described under
14		paragraph (1) with established standards and ethics;
15		and
16	(4)	Does not otherwise provide massage therapy for
17		clients, whether or not for compensation.

1	(b) Establishments that offer only the services as
2	described in subsection (a) shall be exempt from licensure as
3	provided in section 452-3.
4	(c) Any person exempt from licensure as provided by this
5	section shall be exempt from the advertising regulations
6	established pursuant to section 452-23."
7	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
8	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
9	begun before its effective date.
10	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
