A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COLLEGE OF TROPICAL AGRICULTURE AND HUMAN RESOURCES COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The University of Hawaii college of tropical
- 2 agriculture and human resources is in critical need of personnel
- 3 for its cooperative extension service to improve and strengthen
- 4 Hawaii's sustainability in agriculture through educational
- 5 programs. The college of tropical agriculture and human
- 6 resources houses a cooperative extension service, which partners
- 7 with federal, state, and county governments to provide science-
- 8 based information and education programs in agriculture, natural
- 9 resources, and human resources. The cooperative extension
- 10 service offices are located throughout the State, with roughly
- 11 twenty-five extension agents statewide. The cooperative
- 12 extension service provides valuable tools accessible to the
- 13 public to strengthen communities and sustain Hawaii's
- 14 agricultural economy. Extension personnel provide various
- 15 services to communities within each county, such as individual
- 16 consultations; educational workshops; and short courses on

- 1 relevant subjects, including home economics, family living, 4-H
- 2 and other youth activities, nutrition, and health.
- 3 Over the past twenty years, the college of tropical
- 4 agriculture and human resources cooperative extension service
- 5 has experienced a forty-three per cent decrease in extension
- 6 agents who serve the various counties, including a twenty-seven
- 7 per cent decrease since 2008. Many of the community services
- 8 that the extension service offers have been cut, most
- 9 importantly ornamental plant services, the production of which
- 10 exceeds \$70,000,000 annually in wholesale value.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to address the budgetary
- 12 shortfalls experienced by the University of Hawaii college of
- 13 tropical agriculture and human resources cooperative extension
- 14 service by appropriating moneys for additional full-time
- 15 equivalent ornamental plant extension agent positions.
- 16 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to the
- 19 university of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human
- 20 resources cooperative extension service for four full-time
- 21 equivalent (4.0 FTE) ornamental plant extension agents; provided

- 1 that one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) position each shall be
- 2 located in the city and county of Honolulu, eastern portion of
- 3 the county of Hawaii, county of Maui, and county of Kauai.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 5 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. The college of tropical agriculture and human
- 7 resources of the University of Hawaii shall submit a report to
- 8 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 9 of the regular session of 2019 on the status of ornamental plant
- 10 extension agent positions and the reasons behind any vacancies
- 11 that may exist.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.
