

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FOOD SUSTAINABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) Pursuant to section 226-55, Hawaii Revised 2 Statutes, the office of planning, in coordination with the 3 appropriate departmental agency, shall prepare and periodically 4 update a functional plan for seafood sustainability that expands 5 the State's priority on food by including wild seafood as a 6 viable food source. (b) As part of the functional plan for seafood 7 sustainability, the office of planning and the appropriate 8 9 departmental agency shall consider the following: 10 (1) Establishing objectives, policies, and actions related 11 to seafood sustainability; 12 Researching the agricultural and economic impact that (2) 13 wild seafood has on food self-sufficiency in the
- State, including its influence on non-commercial consumption, such as community sharing and fisher household consumption, and exports; 16

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1	(3)	Collecting data on the wholesale and retail sales of
2		wild seafood in the State;
3	(4)	Classifying and regulating wild seafood as a food
4		commodity in the State; and
5	(5)	Incorporating the functional plan for seafood
6		sustainability, in part or in whole, into the state
7		agricultural functional plan related to increased food
8		security and food self-sufficiency.
9	(c)	The office of planning and the appropriate
10	departmental agency shall submit the functional plan, including	
11	any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than	
12	twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of	
13	2019.	
14	(d)	For the purposes of this section, "wild seafood" means
15	naturally-born or hatchery-raised fish and shellfish harvested	
16	in the wild through commercial, recreational, or subsistence	
17	fishing,	but excluding net-pen aquacultural or other farm-raised
18	fish.	
19	SECT	ION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:
