A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's natural

2 environment and ecosystems are in a fragile state due to the

3 amount of greenhouse gases released through human activities and

4 the resulting impact on global climate change. The legislature

5 also finds that the State should support programs that

6 incentivize state agencies, private entities, and individuals to

7 adopt practices that are more environmentally friendly and that

8 result in reduced carbon emissions into the environment. The

9 legislature notes that one mechanism that has gained success in

Europe after adoption of the Kyoto Protocol is the transferring

11 and selling of carbon offset credits. California and numerous

other states and private industries have established these types

13 of credits for purchase by polluters to offset their carbon

14 emissions. Billions of dollars have been raised by California

15 alone, and many industries are seeking new places to invest

16 these dollars to offset their carbon emissions.

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The legislature further finds that it is necessary to 1 invest state funds to improve the State's water infrastructure 2 3 and ensure future water sustainability in the face of ongoing climate change. More specifically, the State must be prepared 4 to provide more resources and support for those affected by 5 6 disaster-scale flooding, coastal seawater inundation, and shortages of potable water and agricultural water. The 7 8 legislature anticipates that the revenues raised by a state 9 carbon offsets program will greatly enhance current water 10 sustainability efforts. Accordingly, the legislature finds that it is in the public 11 interest to create a carbon credit revenue program in the State 12 13 that would incentivize and reward the adoption, practice, and adherence to carbon emission reduction activities, consistent 14 15 with the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan. The purpose of this Act is to establish a program under the 16 department of business, economic development, and tourism that 17 administers revenues realized from the sale of carbon credits in 18 any established carbon registry and invests those proceeds in **19** 20 projects that improve the State's water infrastructure or 21 mitigate threats to water sustainability due to climate change.

1	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designate	d and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§</u> 20	1- Carbon credit revenue program. (a) The
5	departmen	t shall establish a carbon credit revenue program that:
6	(1)	Administers any and all revenues realized from the
7		sale of any carbon credits or offsets in any
8		established international or national carbon
9		registries through project developers or by
10		departments or state agencies. Proceeds and revenues
11		generated from sales of carbon offset credits shall be
12		invested in projects that improve the State's water
13		infrastructure or mitigate threats to water
14		sustainability due to climate change, including but
15		not limited to:
16		(A) Flood prevention and preparedness;
17		(B) Mitigation of sea level rise;
18		(C) Increasing potable water supplies; and
19		(D) Increasing agricultural water supplies;
20	(2)	Provides environmental, social, cultural, or economic
21		benefits, including but not limited to the improvement

1		of the State's water infrastructure or mitigation of
2		threats to water sustainability due to climate change;
3		and
4	(3)	Is consistent with the state's sustainability goals
5		and policies.
6	(b)	The department shall adopt rules, pursuant to chapter
7	91, neces	sary to carry out the purposes of this section.
8	<u>(c)</u>	As used in this section:
9	"Car	bon credit" means a tradable credit issued by an
10	independent international or national carbon registry program	
11	that represents a greenhouse gas reduction or greenhouse gas	
12	removale	enhancement that is equivalent to one metric ton of
13	carbon dioxide equivalent and meets the requirements of the	
14	program.	
15	"Carbon credit revenue" means the revenue realized by state	
16	agencies from the sale of any carbon sequestration credits.	
17	"Carbon offset" means a compensatory measure made by an	
18	agency or	individual to reduce carbon emissions, which may
19	include t	the adoption of practices that increase the absorption
20	of carbor	n dioxide.

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"Carbon registry" means any established international or 1 2 national carbon registry program which serve voluntary and 3 compliance markets and provide an independent carbon standard to 4 verify and certify forest carbon projects and issues carbon 5 credits. 6 "Program" means the carbon credit revenues program 7 administered by the department. "State agency" means a unit of state government, such as a 8 department, division, branch, agency, program, or office, and 9 10 includes the legislature, judiciary, and office of Hawaiian 11 affairs." SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored. 12

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 28, 2045.

DBEDT; Carbon Credits Revenue Program; Water Infrastructure; Climate Change

Description:

Establishes a carbon credit revenue program under the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism that administers revenues realized from the sale of any carbon credits in any established carbon registry and uses the resulting proceeds to fund projects that improve the State's water infrastructure or mitigate threats to water sustainability efforts due to climate change.
