BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 346-222, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended as follows: 3 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 4 and to read: 5 ""Physical isolation" means denial of the ability and means 6 to communicate, visit, or interact with family, friends, and 7 care providers. Physical isolation shall not include an act 8 reasonably intended to protect the physical or mental welfare of 9 the vulnerable adult, such as through protective orders, 10 treatment plans, or instructions of the vulnerable adult's 11 physician or other health care professional." 12 2.
