A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. For many years, the State has used homeless
- 2 shelters and transitional group homes as an interim measure
- 3 while attempting to place as many persons experiencing
- 4 homelessness as possible into subsidized rentals and
- 5 traditionally-constructed apartments. Economic constraints,
- 6 construction delays, and landlords' resistance to accepting
- 7 homeless tenants have made the supply of subsidized rentals and
- 8 traditionally-constructed housing inadequate to meet the demand
- 9 by persons experiencing homelessness. In addition, many persons
- 10 who struggle with mental illness or substance abuse are forced
- 11 to live unsheltered because they cannot reside in close quarters
- 12 with others in a shelter or group home.
- 13 However, recent technological innovations have made it
- 14 possible to build enough dwellings for every homeless person in
- 15 Hawaii at a lower cost than what the State spends on the
- 16 ancillary costs for unsheltered and nomadic homeless persons.
- 17 These innovations will allow the State to place more individuals

- 1 experiencing homelessness into housing more expeditiously and in
- 2 accordance with housing first principles.
- 3 Multiple national studies show that housing first programs
- 4 are enormously effective, mostly because the programs combine
- 5 the stability of a permanent home with supportive services and
- 6 treatment. As a result, housing first programs also foster
- 7 recovery from addiction, mental illness, and other afflictions
- 8 of homeless persons.
- 9 The legislature finds that chronic, unsheltered, nomadic
- 10 homelessness is a humanitarian disaster endangering public
- 11 health and safety. The legislature also finds that there is
- 12 sufficient under- or unutilized state land suitable for the
- 13 construction of homeless villages. The legislature further
- 14 finds that the use of current technology to build homeless
- 15 villages on state land will allow the State to create housing
- 16 and implement housing first principles on a scale large enough
- 17 to greatly reduce, if not end, homelessness in Hawaii.
- 18 The purpose of this Act is to increase efforts to reduce
- 19 homelessness by:

1	(1)	Requiring the governor to identify certain parcels of
2		state land for the purpose of establishing homeless
3		villages for individuals experiencing homelessness;
4	(2)	Requiring the department of human services to provide
5		assessments, services, and referral services for
6		individuals within the homeless villages under a
7		housing first paradigm; and
8	(3)	Requiring the department of human services, in
9		consultation with the governor, to submit reports to
10		the legislature identifying parcels of land to
11		establish a homeless village and any findings and
12		recommendations relating to the Puuhonua homeless
13		villages program.
14	SECT	ION 2. This Act shall be known as the Puuhonua
15	homeless	villages act.
16	SECT	ION 3. (a) The governor shall take all steps and
17	engage in	all actions necessary to identify parcels of state
18	land for	the purpose of providing housing and supportive
19	services	to homeless persons.
20	(b)	The governor shall submit a report to the legislature
21	no later	than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular

- 1 session on the progress made in acquiring the parcels of state
- 2 land specified in subsection (a) until all required parcels of
- 3 land have been acquired for the purposes of this Act.
- 4 SECTION 4. (a) There is established within the department
- 5 of human services a Puuhonua homeless villages program. The
- 6 program shall provide housing and supportive services to
- 7 individuals experiencing homelessness under a housing first
- 8 paradigm. A minimum of homes shall be completed within
- 9 two years after the effective date of this Act or two years
- 10 after the date the governor makes the applicable land available
- 11 for the Puuhonua homeless villages program, whichever occurs
- 12 later.
- (b) Each homeless village shall:
- 14 (1) Be a minimum of one-half acre in size and contain no
- more than one hundred homes;
- 16 (2) Have a community center, which the department of human
- 17 services shall make reasonable efforts to complete at
- a cost of \$100,000 or less for each community center,
- 19 that includes:
- 20 (A) Communal showers;
- 21 (B) Bathrooms;

1		(C) A kitchen;	
2		(D) Lockers for residents' va	luables;
3		(E) Mailboxes for incoming ma	il; and
4		(F) A multipurpose room for re	esidential meetings and
5		supportive services; and	
6	(3)	Have systems to dispose of tra	sh and other waste.
7	(c)	Each home within the homeless	village shall adhere to
8	the follo	ing requirements:	
9	(1)	The construction cost for each	home shall not exceed
10		\$15,000;	
11	(2)	Each home shall have at least	chree hundred square
12		feet of living space, electric	ity with lighting, and a
13		minimum of eight standard elec	trical outlets; and
14	(3)	Each home shall be a private d	welling for an
15		individual or family experienc	ing homelessness;
16		provided that unrelated individ	duals shall not be
17		required to share a home.	
18	(d)	Individuals or families experi	encing homelessness
19	shall be	narged the cost of rent, utili	ties, and supportive
20	services	s follows:	

1	(1)	Individuals and families experiencing nomelessness and
2		who have no income shall not be charged;
3	(2)	Individuals experiencing homelessness and who have
4		income shall not be charged more than twenty per cent
5		of the individual's gross monthly income; and
6	(3)	Families experiencing homelessness and who have income
7		shall not be charged more than twenty per cent of the
8		family's aggregate monthly income, less \$100 per month
9		for each dependent family member that resides in the
10		home;
11	provided	that the department may adjust these amounts for

13	(e)	The department of human services shall:

- 4 (h) The department of human services, in consultation with
- 5 the governor, shall submit a report to the legislature on the
- 6 progress made in acquiring the parcels of state land identified
- 7 in section 3 or this Act no later than twenty days prior to the
- 8 convening of the regular session of 2020.
- 9 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to
- 12 establish the Puuhonua homeless villages program and construct
- 13 homes and infrastructure as required by this Act.
- 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 15 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 18 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for
- 19 the management, maintenance, and day-to-day operations of
- 20 Puuhonua homeless villages as required by this Act.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
