### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that according to the
2	2017 Hawaii Statewide Homeless Point-in-Time Count, the number
3	of homeless people on Oahu rose by nearly fourteen per cent
4	since 2012. Despite increased efforts and resources to reduce
5	homelessness in Hawaii, homelessness has remained a significant
6	issue. Homeless individuals often rely on panhandling for
7	income. Citations and jail time for panhandling can be

- disruptive and exacerbate homelessness. Further, it has often 8
- 9 been difficult for service providers to connect with homeless
- 10 individuals and identify the services they need, such as mental
- 11 health or substance abuse treatment.
- 12 The legislature recognizes that pilot programs throughout
- 13 the United States provide homeless individuals with temporary
- 14 work while providing easy access to services. A pilot program
- 15 launched in Albuquerque, New Mexico in 2015 has received
- 16 national attention. The program connects homeless individuals
- with work cleaning up public spaces and is proving to be a 17

- 1 success. A similar program introduced in Tucson, Arizona
- 2 assists homeless individuals with temporary jobs.
- 3 The legislature further finds that in Hawaii, some service
- 4 providers assist homeless individuals with temporary work.
- 5 However, those programs are limited to small areas and thus are
- 6 not available to the vast majority of homeless individuals in
- 7 communities throughout the State. The legislature also finds
- 8 that since problems like graffiti and litter remain prevalent
- 9 throughout Hawaii, the State could employ homeless individuals
- 10 to help reduce those problems.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to establish a pilot program
- **12** that:
- 13 (1) Assists homeless individuals by connecting them to
- 14 temporary job opportunities; and
- (2) Connects homeless individuals with service providers.
- 16 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a three-year homeless
- 17 employment grant program that shall be developed by the
- 18 department of human services.
- 19 (b) The department of human services shall contract with a
- 20 service provider or other qualified person or entity to

- 1 administer the program; provided that the contract shall be
- 2 exempt from chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 3 (c) The homeless employment grant program shall:
- 4 (1) Connect homeless individuals with work opportunities;
- 5 (2) Pay individuals in the program for the hours they
- 6 worked in the day, which may include a limited amount
- of time spent with service providers; provided that
- 8 the source of funding for the payments shall be the
- 9 homeless employment grant program's funds;
- 10 (3) Connect homeless individuals with service providers at
- the appropriate time; and
- 12 (4) When appropriate, transport participants in the
- program to a shelter at the end of the work day.
- 14 (d) The homeless individuals who work pursuant to
- 15 subsection (c) shall not be considered employees of the State
- 16 solely as a result of their work in the pilot program.
- (e) The State shall be immune from suit and liability for
- 18 any claim for damage to or loss of property, personal injury, or
- 19 other civil liability caused, arising out of, or relating to any
- 20 actual or alleged act, error, or omission that occurred at any

- 1 stage of the planning and administration of the homeless
- 2 employment grant program.
- 3 SECTION 3. The department of human services shall submit a
- 4 report that includes:
- 5 (1) The progress made toward implementing the homeless
- 6 employment grant program;
- 7 (2) Any findings and recommendations; and
- **8** (3) Any necessary proposed legislation,
- 9 to the legislature no later than twenty days before the
- 10 convening of the regular session of 2019.
- 11 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for
- 14 the purpose of establishing a three-year homeless employment
- 15 grant program.
- 16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 17 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000;
- 19 provided that section 2 shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Homeless Employment Grant Program; Appropriation

Establishes a 3-year homeless employment grant program that provides homeless individuals with work opportunities and connects them with service providers to begin 7/1/2020. Requires the Department of Human Services to submit a report to the Legislature on the program. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (SD1)
