

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 23, Hawaii Revised Statute	es, is amended	
2	by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§23-</u> <u>Elections; audit.</u> (a) The auditor	shall conduct	
5	an information systems and operational audit of the voting		
6	systems used in three randomly selected races for public office		
7	in each statewide primary and general election held in the		
8	State. The audits shall include a review of the following:		
9	(1) The operation, performance, and conduct	(1) The operation, performance, and conduct of the	
10	respective elections;		
11	(2) The accuracy, reliability, and timing of voting		
12	procedures and election results;		
13	(3) The accuracy of electronic voting systems compared to		
14	paper ballot voting system records;		
15	(4) The responsibilities, services, and activities of		
16	election officials; and

1	(5) Any additional audit issues that the auditor deems		
2	appropriate.		
3	(b) The office of elections, county clerks, and election		
4	officials shall fully cooperate with and provide assistance to		
5	the auditor as needed with respect to its audit, and shall		
6	respond promptly to the auditor's requests in conducting its		
7	audit, including by providing records and other information		
8	requested in the course of the audit.		
9	(c) The auditor shall submit a report of its findings and		
10	recommendations, including recommendations to increase		
11	efficiency, accuracy, and voter turnout in elections, to the		
12	legislature no later than twenty days before the convening of		
13	the regular session following the year in which the audits are		
14	conducted."		
15	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.		
16	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
