A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MINORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that being lesbian, gay,
- 2 bisexual, or transgender is not a disease, disorder, illness,
- 3 deficiency, or shortcoming. Major professional associations of
- 4 mental health practitioners and researchers in the United States
- 5 have recognized these facts for nearly forty years.
- 6 The American Psychological Association convened a task
- 7 force on appropriate therapeutic responses to sexual
- 8 orientation. The task force conducted a systematic review of
- 9 peer-reviewed journal literature on sexual orientation change
- 10 efforts. The task force concluded that sexual orientation
- 11 change efforts can pose critical health risks to lesbian, gay,
- 12 and bisexual individuals, including confusion, depression,
- 13 quilt, helplessness, shame, social withdrawal, suicide,
- 14 substance abuse, and other negative feelings and behaviors.
- 15 The legislature further finds that other studies confirm
- 16 the serious health risks that minors face when they experience
- 17 family rejection based on their sexual orientation. In one



- 1 study, lesbian, gay, and bisexual young adults who reported high
- 2 levels of family rejection during adolescence were 8.4 times
- 3 more likely to report having attempted suicide, 5.9 times more
- 4 likely to report high levels of depression, 3.4 times more
- 5 likely to use illegal drugs, and 3.4 times more likely to report
- 6 having engaged in unprotected sexual intercourse compared with
- 7 peers from families that reported no or low levels of family
- 8 rejection. The legislature therefore concludes that all minors,
- 9 especially lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender minors who
- 10 experience family rejection, should be protected against sexual
- 11 orientation change efforts by teachers and counseling
- 12 professionals.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to protect the physical and
- 14 psychological well-being of minors, including lesbian, gay,
- 15 bisexual, and transgender youth, against exposure to serious
- 16 harms caused by sexual orientation change efforts.
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 19 and to read as follows:

8	change efforts" means the practice of attempting to change a		
9	person's sexual orientation, including but not limited to		
10	efforts to change behaviors, gender identity, or gender		
11	expressions; or to reduce or eliminate sexual or romantic		
12	attractions or feelings toward a person of the same gender.		
13	"Sexual orientation change efforts" shall not include		
14	counseling for a person seeking to transition from one gender to		
15	another or counseling that:		
16	<u>(1)</u> Pr	ovides acceptance, support, and understanding of a	
17	<u>p</u> e	rson or facilitates a person's coping, social	
18	su	pport, and identity exploration and development,	
19	in	cluding sexual orientation-neutral interventions to	
20	pr	event or address unlawful conduct or unsafe sexual	
21	pr	actices; and	

1	(2)	Does not seek to change sexual orientation."	
2	SECTION 3. Chapter 436B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
3	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
4	and to read as follows:		
5	"§436B- Sexual orientation change efforts prohibited;		
6	advertising prohibited. (a) No person who is licensed to		
7	provide professional counseling, including but not limited to a		
8	physician specializing in the practice of psychiatry, physician		
9	assistant, psychologist, social worker, mental health counselor,		
10	marriage and family therapist, or a person who performs		
11	counseling as part of the person's professional training for any		
12	of these professions, shall:		
13	(1)	Engage in sexual orientation change efforts, as	
14		defined in section 302A- , on a person under	
15		eighteen years of age; or	
16	(2)	Advertise the offering of sexual orientation change	
17		efforts, as defined in section 302A- , on a person	
18		under eighteen years of age.	
19	(b)	Any person who is licensed to provide professional	
20	counseling	g who attempts to engage in sexual orientation change	
21	efforts or advertises the offering of sexual advertising change		

- 1 efforts on a person under eighteen years of age shall be subject
- 2 to disciplinary action by the appropriate professional licensing
- 3 authority.
- 4 (c) In addition to the penalties under subsection (b),
- 5 advertising the offering of sexual advertising change efforts on
- 6 a person under eighteen years of age shall constitute an unfair
- 7 or deceptive act or practice under section 480-2."
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 9 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 10 begun before its effective date.
- 11 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
