A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COLLEGE SERVICE CORPS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Many universities within our nation have

 adopted a modified model of President Franklin Delano

 Roosevelt's Civilian Conservation Corps program, originally
- $\mathbf{4}$ intended to provide alternative employment for Americans
- 5 following the Great Depression, to narrow the gap between local
- 6 education and career opportunities, while stimulating the short-
- 7 term and long-term development of environment, economy, and
- ${f 8}$ society-oriented community projects.
- 9 Along with providing a way to meet local needs and increase
- 10 civic awareness and social advancement, these college services
- 11 corps programs can help new graduates gauge career readiness and
- 12 offer preparation through technical training, assistance, and
- 13 other support, including professional development through real
- 14 world experience.
- 15 To increase access to higher education and work
- 16 opportunities for volunteers at various education levels, a
- 17 college services corps program can qualify successful volunteers

- 1 for tuition reduction or full scholarships at various
- 2 educational programs under their jurisdiction.
- 3 The purpose of this measure is to encourage recent high
- 4 school graduates to volunteer for similar service corps programs
- 5 in Hawaii by providing educational benefits to individuals who
- 6 have successfully completed a Hawaii college services corps
- 7 program.
- 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by adding a new section to part II, subpart B, to be
- 10 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 11 "§304A- Hawaii college service corps program. (a) There
- 12 is established the Hawaii college service corps program, which
- 13 shall be placed within the University of Hawaii for
- 14 administrative purposes. The mission of the program shall be to
- 15 encourage recent Hawaii high school graduates to participate in
- 16 college service corps programs by rewarding those individuals
- 17 with tuition waivers and college credit for subsequent
- 18 enrollment in schools within the University of Hawaii system.
- (b) Each full year of successful participation in a
- 20 qualifying college service corps program shall qualify the
- 21 participant for four semesters of tuition waivers. No

- 1 participant shall earn more than eight semesters of tuition
- 2 waivers pursuant to this section.
- 3 (c) Each month of successful participation in a qualifying
- 4 college service corps program shall earn the participant one
- 5 credit hour, or equivalent thereof, up to a maximum of twenty-
- 6 four credit hours.
- 7 (d) Tuition waivers and credit hours earned through the
- 8 Hawaii college service corps program shall apply to an
- 9 associate's or bachelor's degree at a school within the
- 10 University of Hawaii system.
- 11 (e) The University of Hawaii may seek private donations to
- 12 offset the costs of providing tuition waivers pursuant to this
- 13 section."
- 14 SECTION 3. No later than July 1, 2019, the University of
- 15 Hawaii shall publish a list of college service corps programs
- 16 that qualify for tuition waivers and college credit pursuant to
- 17 this Act. In establishing the list of qualified college service
- 18 corps program, the University of Hawaii:
- (1) Shall consult with the Department of Land and Natural
- 20 Resources, Division of Conservation and Resources
- 21 Enforcement, to determine the feasibility of

1		establishing patrol assignments as part of a qualified
2		college service corps program;
3	(2)	Shall consult with the Department of Education to
4		determine the feasibility of alleviating teacher
5		shortages by establishing teaching assistant positions
6		as part of a qualified college service corps program;
7		and
8	(3)	May consult with other government entities, including
9		other departments and counties in Hawaii, to determine
10		the feasibility of establishing assignments,
11		internships, or positions as part of a qualified
12		college service corps program.
13	SECT	ION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
