## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CESSPOOLS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. (a) The department of health shall hire a
 third-party consultant to conduct a study on the upgrade,
 conversion, or connection of cesspools statewide, including
 financing issues and financing mechanisms. The study shall be
 conducted in collaboration with the working group established
 under subsection (b). At a minimum, the study shall:

- 7 (1) Determine all financing mechanisms available to
  8 upgrade all category 1, 2, and 3 cesspools within
  9 twenty years;
- 10 (2) Explore the feasibility of various sources of funding
  11 including grants, loans, fees, real property taxes,
  12 creation of special assessment districts, or a
  13 combination of funding sources for the upgrading of
  14 all category 1, 2, and 3 cesspools;
  15 (3) Research best practices used by other jurisdictions
- 16 throughout the United States for cesspool conversions;



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1	(4)	Consider individual homeowners' ability to pay for
2		cesspool conversion and the possible provision of tax
3		exemptions based on individual income levels to assist
4		homeowners in paying for cesspool conversion;
5	(5)	Research and make recommendations on state and county
6		partnerships to implement any cesspool conversion plan
7		and assist homeowners with cesspool conversions;
8	(6)	Include feedback from community members on each island
9		as well as feedback from each county's wastewater
10		division;
11	(7)	Evaluate mandatory versus voluntary participation in
12		any cesspool conversion plan;
13	(8)	Consider the use of alternative septic system
14		technologies appropriate to the various areas where
15		cesspools are located;
16	(9)	Assess and develop a methodology for comprehensive
17		data collection and analysis of the effects of
18		cesspools on groundwater, surface water, and nearshore
19		waters statewide; and
20	(10)	Include any other information deemed necessary or
21		appropriate by the department of health, the working



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1		group established under subsection (b), or the third-
2		party consultant.
3	(b)	There is established a cesspool conversion working
4	group wit	hin the department of health for administrative
5	purposes.	The working group shall consist of the following
6	members:	
7	(1)	The director of health, or the director's designee,
8		who shall serve as the chair of the working group;
9	(2)	The branch chief of the clean water branch of the
10		department of health, or the branch chief's designee;
11	(3)	The branch chief of the sanitation branch of the
12		department of health, or the branch chief's designee;
13	(4)	The administrator of the division of aquatic resources
14		of the department of land and natural resources, or
15		the administrator's designee;
16	(5)	Four members representing the appropriate wastewater
17		agency from each county, appointed by the mayor of the
18		county in which the agency is located;
19	(6)	A member of the house of representatives, appointed by
20		the speaker of the house;



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1	(7)	A member of the senate, appointed by the president of	
2		the senate;	
3	(8)	A county director of finance, appointed by the Hawaii	
4		council of mayors;	
5	(9)	A member representing the sanitation industry,	
6		appointed by the president of the senate; and	
7	(10)	A member representing environmental groups, appointed	
8		by the speaker of the house.	
9	(c)	The cesspool conversion working group shall work in	
10	collaboration with the third-party consultant hired by the		
11	department	t of health to conduct the study under subsection (a).	
12	(d)	Members of the cesspool conversion working group shall	
13	serve wit	hout compensation but shall be reimbursed for necessary	
14	expenses,	including air transportation, to attend meetings of	
15	the workin	ng group and in the discharge of duties of the working	
16	group.		
17	(e)	No member of the working group shall be made subject	
18	to section	n 84-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely because of	
19	that membe	er's participation as a member of the working group.	
20	(f)	The cesspool conversion working group shall cease to	
21	exist on a	January 1, 2020.	



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1 SECTION 2. The director of health, in consultation with the cesspool conversion working group, shall submit an interim 2 3 report, including findings and recommendations, to the 4 legislature no later than December 31, 2018, and shall submit a 5 final report, including findings, recommendations, and any proposed legislation to the legislature no later than twenty 6 7 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2020. 8 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ . . . or so much 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to conduct 11 a study on the upgrade, conversion, or connection of cesspools 12 statewide, including financing issues and financing mechanisms. 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 14 health for the purposes of this Act.

15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018, and16 shall be repealed on January 1, 2020.
