A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that behavior analysis
- 2 means the design, implementation, and evaluation of
- 3 instructional and environmental modifications to produce
- 4 socially significant improvements in human behavior. The
- 5 practice of behavior analysis includes the empirical
- 6 identification of functional relations between behavior and
- 7 environmental factors, known as functional assessment and
- 8 analysis, as well as the use of contextual factors, motivating
- 9 operations, antecedent stimuli, positive reinforcement, and
- 10 other consequences to help people develop new behaviors,
- 11 increase or decrease existing behaviors, and emit behaviors
- 12 under specific environmental conditions.
- 13 The legislature further finds that Act 199, Session Laws of
- 14 Hawaii 2015, established the behavior analyst program within the
- 15 department of commerce and consumer affairs and established
- 16 licensing requirements for behavior analysts. Licensing of
- 17 behavior analysis services was made concurrent with mandated

- 1 insurance coverage for diagnosis and treatment related to autism
- 2 disorders.
- 3 Also, the legislature finds that Act 107, Session Laws of
- 4 Hawaii 2016, temporarily exempted some practitioners from
- 5 licensing requirements of the practice of behavior analysis, in
- 6 particular, direct support workers who provide autism treatment
- 7 services pursuant to an individualized education plan.
- 8 The legislature additionally finds that many students
- 9 enrolled in department of education schools would benefit from
- 10 the expansion of behavior analysis services throughout Hawaii's
- 11 public school system, including, but not limited to, students
- 12 with autism disorders.
- 13 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to provide an
- 14 additional two years for the department of education to
- 15 implement these services within the department.
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 465D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 18 "(a) This chapter is not intended to restrict the practice
- 19 of other licensed or credentialed practitioners practicing
- 20 within their own recognized scopes of practice and shall not
