A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 115, Session
- 2 Laws of Hawaii 1998, was enacted in response to the economic
- 3 revitalization task force's principal recommendation to provide
- 4 greater autonomy to the University of Hawaii in the fulfillment
- 5 of its constitutional role and the administration of its
- 6 constitutionally-designated assets and public trust
- 7 undertakings. Unlike most state agencies, the university has
- 8 the authority to transfer appropriated funds and positions among
- 9 programs and between fiscal quarters without legislative
- 10 authorization. The university is currently required to account
- 11 for these transfers in fiscal year-end reports to the
- 12 legislature.
- 13 The legislature further finds that as a matter of statewide
- 14 concern, the university's financial flexibility should be
- 15 transparent and subject to more frequent reporting to the
- 16 legislature.
