A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TEACHER STANDARDS BOARD

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 302A-801, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (a) and (b) to read as follows:
3	$^{ extsf{ iny II}}$ (a) There is established the Hawaii teacher standards
4	board, which shall be placed within the department for
5	administrative purposes only. The board shall consist of
6	[fifteen] seventeen members, including not less than six
7	licensed teachers regularly engaged in teaching at the time of
8	the appointment, three educational officers employed at the time
9	of the appointment, the chairperson of the board of education or
10	the chairperson's designee, the superintendent or the
11	superintendent's designee, a representative of independent
12	schools, the dean of the University of Hawaii college of
13	education or the dean's designee[+] and the chairperson of the
14	Native Hawaiian Education Council or designee; provided that one
15	teacher member shall be engaged in teaching at a Hawaii public
16	charter school at the time of appointment and the dean's
17	designee shall be chosen from the member institutions of the

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- 1 teacher education coordinating committee established under
- 2 section 304A-1202, and two members of the public. A non-voting
- 3 teacher candidate from a Hawaii educator preparation program at
- 4 a public institution of higher education on a rotating basis
- 5 shall be appointed by the chairperson of the teacher education
- 6 coordinating committee to serve a one-year term.
- 7 (b) Except for the chairperson of the board of education,
- 8 superintendent, [and] dean of the college of education, the
- 9 chairperson of the Native Hawaiian Education Council, and the
- 10 teacher candidate member, the governor shall appoint the members
- 11 of the board pursuant to section 26-34, from a list of qualified
- 12 nominees submitted to the governor by the departments, agencies,
- 13 education stakeholder groups, and organizations representative
- 14 of the constituencies of the board; provided that the governor
- 15 may request additional names of qualified nominees from the
- 16 departments, agencies, education stakeholder groups, and
- 17 organizations representative of the constituencies of the board
- 18 at any time. To the extent possible, the board membership shall
- 19 reflect a combination of abilities, breadth of experiences, and
- 20 characteristics that will best serve the diverse interests and
- 21 needs of elementary and secondary school personnel and the
- 22 education system in Hawaii from early childhood through higher
- 23 education. Such considerations shall include but not be limited

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- 1 to reflecting the diversity of the student population,
- 2 geographical representation, and a broad representation of
- 3 education-related stakeholders."
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 302A-805, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "§302A-805 Teachers; license required; renewals.
- 7 [Beginning July 1, 2002, all new licenses shall be issued by the
- 8 board.] No person shall serve as a half-time or full-time
- 9 teacher in a public school without first having obtained a
- 10 license or permit from the board under this subpart. All
- 11 licenses and permits issued by the board shall be valid only for
- 12 the fields specified on the licenses and permits and shall be
- 13 renewable every five years for a standard license and every ten
- 14 years for an advanced license or permit if the individual
- 15 continues to:
- 16 (1) Satisfy the board's licensing and permit standards and
- submits verification, in a form specified by the
- 18 board, that the individual has completed activities
- specified by the board in fulfillment of each of the
- 20 teacher performance standards established by the
- 21 board;
- 22 (2) Show evidence of successful teaching in the previous

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1 five years through verification by a supervisor, in a 2 form specified by the board; 3 (3) Meet the professional fitness requirements established 4 by the board; 5 (4)Satisfy the board's requirements for renewal of 6 Licenses and permits; and 7 Pay all applicable license and permit fees in a timely (5) 8 manner. The board shall randomly audit a licensee's or permit 9 holder's compliance with paragraph (1) and may establish rules, 10 pursuant to chapter 91, for the random audits. 11 No person shall be issued a license or permit or teach on **12** an emergency basis in the public schools without having first 13 paid the fees established by the board in accordance with 14 chapter 91. 15 The failure to timely renew a license or permit, pay all 16 fees in a timely manner, or comply with any other requirement 17 provided by law or administrative rule shall result in the 18 automatic forfeiture of the license or permit. A person with a 19 forfeited license or permit shall not teach at a public school 20 until that person's license or permit is restored. Restoration 21 of a license shall require compliance with the renewal 22 requirements provided by law or administrative rule and payment 23 of all applicable renewal and late fees. Upon restoration of a

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1	person's license or permit, the person may teach at a public
2	school."

PURPOSE:

Increase membership on the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board to include a member of the Native Hawaiian Education Council and a non-voting public university student teacher. Clarify that a permit is required for non-licensed teachers serving in public schools.

MEANS:

Amend sections 302A-801 (a) and (b) and section 302A-805, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The addition of a representative from the Native Hawaiian Education Council to the Hawaii Teachers Standards Board will provide insight to teacher preparation and licensure policies that will support the constitutional requirement to support Hawaiian education programs incorporating the study of Hawaiian culture, history, and language.

Inclusion of a non-voting teacher candidate member will provide feedback from emerging teachers to improve preparation program policies and procedures.

The addition of "permits" as a requirement clarifies existing requirements that public school teachers must have the appropriate license or permit issued by the board to be eligible to serve as a public school teacher.

participate on the Board.
