SECTION 1. Section 200-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

RELATING TO DISPOSITION WITHIN STATE BOATING FACILITIES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the board, 3 with the prior authorization of the legislature by concurrent 4 5 resolution, may lease fast lands and submerged lands within an existing state boating facility by public auction, a request for 6 proposals, or by direct negotiation pursuant to section 171-59 7 8 and chapter 190D, for private development, management, and 9 operation[; provided that any lease of fast lands or submerged 10 lands pursuant to a request for proposals shall be subject to 11 section 200-2.6, regardless to which state boating facility the 12 fast or submerged lands are attached].
- 13 As used in this section, the term "state boating facility"
  14 means a state small boat harbor, launching ramp, offshore
  15 mooring, pier, wharf, landing, or any other area under the
  16 jurisdiction of the department pursuant to this chapter."

State Boating Facilities; Disposition

## Description:

Clarifies that the Board of Land and Natural Resources must obtain prior authorization of the Legislature through concurrent resolution to lease all fast lands and submerged lands within any existing state boating facility by public auction, request for proposals, or direct negotiation. Repeals obsolete requirements specific to Ala Wai Boat Harbor. (HB2380 HD1)

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
