A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIQUOR LICENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 281-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 Licenses, temporary. (a) A temporary license of 4 any class and kind specified in section 281-31 may be granted 5 under the following conditions: 6 (1) The premises shall have been operated under a license of the same class, kind, and category issued by the 7 8 liquor commission at least one year immediately prior 9 to the date of filing of the application for a 10 temporary license, except as otherwise approved by the 11 commission; The license of the same class, kind, and category then 12 (2) 13 in effect for the premises shall be surrendered in 14 such manner and at such time as the commission shall 15 direct; 16 (3) The applicant for a temporary license shall have filed **17** with the commission an application for a license of

- (4) The application for a temporary license shall be accompanied by a license fee in such amount as may be prescribed by the commission. If the application is denied or withdrawn, the fee which accompanied the application shall become a realization of the county;
- 8 (5) A temporary license shall be for a period of not in 9 excess of one hundred and twenty days. The license may be renewed at the discretion of the commission for **10** not more than one additional one hundred twenty-day 11 period upon payment of such additional fee as may be 12 13 prescribed by the commission and upon compliance with 14 all conditions required in this section and section 281-31. When a temporary license has expired and no 15 permanent license has been issued, the sale and **16 17** service of liquor shall cease until the permanent license is issued; provided that, when applicable, the 18 19 license shall be properly renewed;
 - (6) A temporary license shall authorize the licensee to purchase liquor only by payment in currency, check, or
