A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATEWIDE TRAFFIC CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that large and high-
- 2 passenger vehicles pose an undue risk to public safety when
- 3 allowed in the fast lane of public highways. High-speed lane
- 4 changes are widely considered to be among the most dangerous
- 5 maneuvers, especially with regard to motorcyclists, whom the
- 6 drivers of large semi-trucks may find difficult to see. In
- 7 addition, efficiency suffers as trucks, trailers, and buses
- 8 cause congestion to the more nimble vehicles behind them.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit large and high-
- 10 passenger vehicles from using the fast lane of public highways.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended by adding a new section to part XII to be appropriately
- 13 designated and to read as follows:
- 14 "§291C- Driving in left-hand lane or along left curb or
- 15 edge; prohibitions. (a) Notwithstanding any contrary provision
- 16 in part XVII, no person driving a vehicle with more than four
- 17 wheels or a high-passenger car shall travel:



1	(1)	In the extreme left-hand lane of a roadway if the
2		roadway is clearly marked for two or more lanes of
3		traffic moving in the same direction; or
4	(2)	Closer to the left-hand curb or left-hand edge than
5		the right-hand curb or right-hand edge of a roadway if
6		the roadway is not clearly marked for two or more
7		lanes.
8	(b)	Subsection (a) shall not apply when:
9	(1)	Traveling a distance not to exceed one thousand feet
10		when preparing for a left turn at an intersection or
11		into a private road or driveway; or
12	(2)	Directed by a police officer or any other person
13		authorized to direct, control, or regulate traffic.
14	<u>(c)</u>	Except as otherwise provided in subsection (d), in
15	case of a	conflict between this section and part XVII, this
16	16 section shall prevail.	
17	(d)	Nothing in this section shall prohibit a person who
18	operates	a public transportation vehicle from traveling in a
19	lane that	has been designated as a zipper lane or diamond lane
20	by the de	partment of transportation."

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 291C-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 ""High-passenger car" means a passenger car, as defined in
- 5 section 286-2, designed for carrying at least eleven
- 6 passengers."
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 9 begun before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Statewide Traffic Code; Left-Lane; Zipper Lane; Diamond Lane

Description:

Prohibits drivers from operating vehicles with more than four wheels and high-passenger cars in the left lane, or close to the left-hand curb or left-hand edge, of a state or county roadway. Exempts drivers operating public transportation vehicles in a zipper lane or diamond lane. (HB2440 HD1)
