

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOSPICE HOMES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 321-1.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) [Beginning with inspections occurring on January 1, 4 2015, the] The department of health shall post on its website 5 electronic copies of reports for all inspections it performs of 6 the following state-licensed care facilities: 7 (1) Adult day health centers; 8 (2) Adult day care centers; 9 (3) Community care foster family homes; 10 Developmental disabilities domiciliary homes as (4)11 defined in section 321-15.9; 12 (5) Developmentally disabled adult foster homes; 13 (6) Long-term care facilities as defined in section 14 349-21(f); [and] Special treatment facilities as defined in section 15 (7) 16 334-1[-]; and Hospice homes as defined in section 321-15.1." 17 (8)

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         SECTION 2. Section 321-1.9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

Section 321-15.63, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: The department of health [may] shall license hospice 5 service agencies. If the department licenses hospice service 6 agencies, the director shall adopt rules in accordance with 7 8 chapter 91 regarding hospice service agencies that shall: Protect the health, safety, welfare, and civil rights 9 (1) of persons residing in their place of residence; and 10 Provide penalties for the failure to comply with any 11 (2) 12 rule. Licensing shall be required annually for the first two 13 14 years of licensure. Thereafter, licensing shall be required biennially; provided that if the department of health receives a 15 complaint regarding the hospice service agency from the time of 16 the last licensure, the licensing shall be required annually 17 until such time as the department is satisfied that licensing 18 19 may proceed biennially."

SECTION 4. Section 457A-1.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending the definition of "state-licensed or state-2 3 certified health care settings" to read as follows: ""State-licensed or state-certified [health] care settings" 4 5 means health care settings, other than medicare or medicaid certified nursing facilities, which are regulated by the 6 department of health." 7 8 SECTION 5. Section 457A-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 10 The director, in accordance with chapters 91 and 92, shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of this chapter in 11 12 accordance with 42 United States Code sections 1395i-3 and 1396r 13 and the federal regulations adopted pursuant thereto, that 14 relate to: The minimum requirements necessary for certification 15 (1) 16 as a nurse aide; Examination requirements, including the passing score 17 (2) and provisions for contesting examination results; 18 Maintenance requirements for continued certification; 19 (3)

- 1 (d) Reciprocity shall be granted to qualified nurse aides
- 2 who have completed a state-approved program, the requirements of

- 4 (e) Maintenance requirements for the recertification
- 5 process shall be required on a biennial basis and shall include
- 6 a competency evaluation approved by the department of human
- 7 services, and employment in a state-licensed or state-certified
- 8 [health] care setting."
- 9 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 11 begun before its effective date.
- 12 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019, and
- 15 shall apply to inspections under sections 1 and 2 of this Act
- 16 that occur on or after January 1, 2020.

Hospice Homes; Hospice Service Agencies; State-Licensed or State-Certified Care Facility; Nurse Aides; Certification; Recertification

Description:

Includes a hospice home operated by a hospice service agency as a state-licensed or state-certified care facility subject to DOH inspections. Requires DOH to license hospice service agencies. Makes conforming amendments to the certification and recertification requirements for nurse aides working in a state-licensed or state-certified care setting. Effective 7/1/2019.
