A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SELECTIVE SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that sufficient

2 armed strength must be achieved and maintained to ensure the

3 security of the United States. In a free society, the

4 obligations and privileges of serving in the armed forces and

5 the reserve components should be shared in accordance with a

6 system of selection that is fair and just, and consistent with

7 maintaining an effective national economy.

8 The legislature finds that to achieve these national

9 security goals, the United States Congress has enacted the

10 United States Military Selective Service Act (50 U.S.C. 3801 et

11 seq.) (formerly 50 U.S.C. App. 451 et seq.), which requires all

12 male citizens and males residing in the United States, except

13 for lawfully admitted non-immigrants, to register with the

14 Selective Service System upon reaching the age of eighteen.

15 The legislature further finds that any person who is not in

16 compliance with the Military Selective Service Act is ineligible

- 1 for federal student financial assistance and employment within
- 2 the executive branch of the federal government.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to require compliance with the
- 4 Military Selective Service Act to be eligible for enrollment in
- 5 a State-supported post-secondary educational institution or
- 6 qualify for state financial assistance for post-secondary
- 7 education, or to be eligible for state or county employment or
- 8 service.
- 9 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 10 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 11 as follows:
- 12 "CHAPTER
- 13 SELECTIVE SERVICE REGISTRATION AWARENESS AND COMPLIANCE ACT
- 14 § -1 Short title. This chapter shall be known as the
- 15 "Selective Service Registration Awareness and Compliance Act".
- 16 § -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
- 17 "Military Selective Service Act" means 50 United States
- 18 Code 3801 et seq.
- 19 § -3 Compliance; post-secondary education enrollment and
- 20 financial assistance. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the

1	contrary,	any person who is not in compliance with the Military
2	Selective	Service Act shall not be:
3	(1)	Permitted to enroll in, or receive education from, a
4		state-supported post-secondary educational
5		institution, including a university, college,
6		community college, professional school, research
7		facility, education center, or institution within the
8		University of Hawaii system; and
9	(2)	Eligible to receive a loan, grant, scholarship, or
10		other financial assistance for post-secondary
11		education that is provided, supported, or guaranteed
12		by the State.
13	(b)	The University of Hawaii shall ensure that applicants
14	and enrol	lees under its jurisdiction comply with the Military
15	Selective	Service Act for the purposes of this section.

20	(1)	Employment by the State or any of its political

subdivisions; and

3		bodies, boards and commissions, departments, agencies,
4		institutions, and instrumentalities.
5	(b)	The State and the respective counties shall ensure
6	that emplo	oyees under their jurisdiction comply with the Military
7	Selective	Service Act for the purposes of this section.
8	\$	-5 Exceptions. A person shall not be denied a right,
9	privilege	, or benefit under this chapter for noncompliance with
10	the Milit	ary Selective Service Act if the person is:
11	(1)	Under eighteen years of age or at least twenty-six
12		years of age;
13	(2)	Serving in the armed forces of the United States on
14		active duty, other than in a reserve or National Guard
15		unit, or has already served in the armed forces or has
16		a condition that would preclude acceptability for
17		military service;
18	(3)	Neither a United States citizen nor a resident
19		immigrant;
20	(4)	A permanent resident of the Trust Territory of the
21		Pacific Islands or the Northern Mariana Islands; or

1	(5) Excused From registration for some other reason
2	provided by the Military Selective Service Act and
3	that reason is included in a written statement.
4	§ -6 Severability. If any provision of this chapter, or
5	the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
6	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
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7 applications of the chapter which can be given without the

8 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions

9 of this chapter are severable."

10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
