A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in 2013, the Kauai 2 county council passed a county ordinance relating to pesticides 3 and genetically modified organisms. That ordinance also 4 contained a provision to create a joint fact finding study group 5 to help address key environmental and public health questions 6 related to large-scale commercial agriculture entities on Kauai. 7 When the ordinance was first struck down by the lower court in 8 2014, the department of agriculture and the Kauai county office 9 of the mayor contracted with a public policy group to facilitate 10 the joint fact finding study group. The fact finding mission 11 took place between January 2015 and April 2016, and on May 25, 12 2016, the study group issued its findings and recommendations. 13 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to 14 implement the findings and recommendations of the joint fact 15 finding study group's report on pesticide use by large 16 agribusinesses on Kauai.

1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the 4 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 5 2018-2019 for implementation of the recommendations published in 6 the joint fact finding study group's May 25, 2016, report on 7 pesticide use by large agribusinesses on Kauai. 8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 31, 2150.
