A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known and cited as the
- 2 "Hawaii Sustainability Act."
- 3 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that not only is climate
- 4 change real and occurring, but it is also the overriding
- 5 challenge of the twenty-first century and one of the priority
- 6 issues of the State. Climate change poses immediate and long-
- 7 term threats to the State's economy, sustainability, security,
- 8 and way of life.
- 9 The legislature recognized in Act 8, Special Session Laws
- 10 of Hawaii 2005, that "many quality-of-life issues, including
- 11 water quality, air quality, land use, energy, and ocean
- 12 resources, are important to the people of Hawaii and should be
- 13 the focus for planning Hawaii's future" and created the Hawaii
- 14 2050 task force and the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan to
- 15 "coordinate the actions needed to sustain a growing and vibrant
- 16 economy, while maintaining a high quality of life for all
- 17 residents and visitors".

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- 1 The legislature recognized in Act 181, Session Laws of
- 2 Hawaii 2011, that the "creation of the Hawaii 2050
- 3 sustainability plan comes as the State faces a growing number of
- 4 pressing issues, including the steady deterioration of public
- 5 infrastructure, the lack of affordable housing, a continued
- 6 reliance on a service-based economy, the vulnerability of Hawaii
- 7 in a volatile global energy market, possible interruptions in
- 8 travel and to critical food supplies, threats to fragile island
- 9 ecosystems, ever-increasing numbers of residents, and an
- 10 increasing number of visitors over the long-term. These issues
- 11 all raise questions about the long-term limits of growth in the
- 12 State and highlight the need to begin planning and acting to
- 13 assure Hawaii's future."
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to establish a stronger policy
- 15 framework for Hawaii's sustainability efforts, including an
- 16 office of sustainability to ensure long-term planning,
- 17 coordination, and implementation of Hawaii's sustainability
- 18 goals and policies.
- 19 SECTION 3. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 20 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 21 as follows:

2	HAWAII SUSTAINABILITY ACT; OFFICE OF SUSTAINABILITY;
3	STATE SUSTAINABILITY SPECIAL FUND
4	§225- Definitions. As used in this chapter:
5	"Director" means the director of the office of
6	sustainability.
7	"Office" means the office of sustainability.
8	"Sustainability" means using, developing, and protecting
9	resources in a manner that enables individuals to meet current
10	needs and ensures that future generations can also meet their
11	needs, from the joint perspective of environmental, economic,
12	and community objectives.
13	§225- Findings and goals regarding sustainability. In
14	addition to the priority guidelines and principles to promote
15	sustainability set forth in section 226-108, the following
16	criteria shall be the goals for the State regarding
17	sustainability:
18	(1) In conducting internal operations, state agencies
19	shall, in cooperation with the office of
20	sustainability and the state sustainability
21	coordinator, seek to achieve the following objectives

1	(A)	State purchases shall be made in a manner that
2		serves the broad, long-term financial interests
3		of the State, including ensuring that
4		environmental, economic, and societal
5		improvements are made to enhance environmental,
6		economic, and societal well-being;
7	(B)	Investments in facilities, equipment, and durable
8		goods shall reflect the highest feasible
9		efficiency and lowest life-cycle costs;
10	(C)	Investments and expenditures shall promote
11		improvements in the efficient use of energy,
12		water, and other resources;
13	(D)	State operations shall be located in diverse
14		locations, including rural and economically
15		distressed communities;
16	(E)	State operations and purchases shall help
17		maintain vital and active urban communities,
18		including downtowns;
19	(F)	State purchases shall support opportunities for
20		economically distressed communities and
21		historically underemployed individuals;

1		(G)	State operations shall reflect partnerships with
2			communities and businesses;
3		(H)	State operations shall help reduce adverse
4			effects on native habitats and species and help
5			restore ecological processes;
6		(I)	State operations shall be conducted in ways that
7			significantly increase the efficient use of
8			energy, water, and other resources; and
9		(J)	State operations and purchases shall reflect the
10			efficient use and reuse of resources and
11			reduction of contaminants released into the
12		•	environment;
13	(2)	In s	supporting sustainable communities, state agencies
14		shal	l seek to enable and encourage local communities
15		to a	chieve the following objectives:
16		(A)	Resilient local economies that provide a
17			diversity of economic opportunities for all
18			residents;
19		(B)	Workers supported by lifelong education to ensure
20			a globally competitive workforce;
21		(C)	An independent and productive citizenry;

1		(D)	Youth supported by strong families and
2			communities;
3		(E)	Urban communities, including downtowns, that are
4			active and vital;
5		(F)	Development that wisely and efficiently uses
6			infrastructure investments and natural resources;
7		(G)	Affordable housing available for residents in
8			community centers;
9		(H)	Healthy urban and rural watersheds, including
10			habitats for fish and wildlife;
11		(I)	Clean and sufficient water for all uses; and
12		(J)	Efficient use and reuse of resources and
13			minimization of harmful emissions into the
14			environment; and
15	(3)	Inte	nsification of efforts to increase the economic
16		stab	ility of communities designated as economically
17		dist	ressed.

- 6 (b) The office of sustainability shall be headed by a
- 7 director. The director shall possess:
- 8 (1) Training in the field of urban and regional planning,
- 9 public administration, or other related fields;
- 10 (2) Experience in programs or services related to
- 11 governmental planning, sustainability planning, and
- 12 planning coordination; and
- 13 (3) Experience in a supervisory or administrative
- 14 capacity.
- 15 The director shall be appointed by the governor without regard
- 16 to chapter 76 and shall be compensated at a rate determined by
- 17 the governor.
- 18 (c) The director shall be included in any benefit program
- 19 generally applicable to officers and employees of the State.
- 20 The director shall hire such staff as may be necessary for the
- 21 purposes of this chapter, in accordance with chapter 76.

1	§225	Office of sustainability; duties. The office of
2	sustainab	lity:
3	(1)	Shall create a strategic plan that includes:
4		(A) Objectives and goals for the office and criteria
5		to measure the goals;
6		(B) The necessary finances to establish and maintain
7		the office;
8		(C) Potential public-private sustainability projects
9		that meet the office's goals and objectives; and
10		(D) The necessary finances to develop, implement, and
11		maintain the potential public-private projects;
12	(2)	Shall gather, analyze, and provide information to the
13		governor to assist in the overall analysis and
14		formulation of state policies and strategies to
15		provide central coordination and cohesion in the
16		allocation of resources and effectuation of state
17		activities and programs, and effectively address
18		current or emerging sustainability issues and
19		opportunities;
20	(3)	Shall identify, evaluate, make recommendations
21		regarding, and propose legislation, regulatory

1		changes, or policy modifications to the governor, the
2		legislature, government agencies, private entities,
3		and other bodies for the purpose of encouraging
4		activities that best sustain, protect, and enhance the
5		quality of the environment, economy, and community for
6		the present and future benefit of the people of
7		Hawaii;
8	(4)	Shall develop and promote policies and programs that
9		assist in the meeting of sustainability goals
10		established in this chapter and the priority
11		guidelines and principles to promote sustainability
12		set forth in section 226-108;
13	(5)	Shall submit to the legislature an annual report on
14		the office's activities and policy recommendations no
15		later than twenty days prior to the convening of each
16		regular session;
17	(6)	May apply for and accept, from whatever source,
18	·	appropriations, gifts or grants of money, or other
19		property;
20	(7)	Shall consult with and seek comment from trade
21		associations, organizations, businesses, and other

1		groups and individuals representing pertinent	
2		interests as part of developing its recommendations;	
3	(8)	Shall develop and promote proposals that jointly and	
4		mutually enhance local economies, the environment, and	
5		community health for the present and future benefit of	
6		the people of Hawaii; and	
7	(9)	May contract with public agencies and private entities	
8		and persons for special research and sustainability	
9		planning assistance.	
10	Noth	ing in this section shall be construed to discourage or	
11	prohibit a	any person or organization from discussing or proposing	
12	mechanisms, including the modification of tax policies, to		
13	promote sustainability.		
14	§225	- Office of sustainability; cooperation. The office	
15	of sustain	nability shall seek the widest possible cooperation	
16	from publ:	ic agencies, including the federal government, as well	
17	as private	e entities and individuals to achieve the purposes of	
18	this chapt	ter. It shall work closely with and assist the	
19	counties :	in the promotion of coordinated state and county	
20	sustainab	ility planning.	

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- 1 Every federal, state, or county agency, and every private
- 2 entity or individual that provides sustainability planning
- 3 programs and services shall be encouraged to participate
- 4 actively in the activities of the office. The executive heads
- 5 of all state departments and agencies shall cooperate with the
- 6 office by providing information to it, as the governor and the
- 7 director of business, economic development, and tourism deem
- 8 necessary for the effective discharge of its duties.
- 9 Nothing in this section shall be construed to delegate or
- 10 detract in any way from the functions, powers, and duties
- 11 conferred by law on any department or agency of the State or
- 12 county.
- 13 §225- State sustainability special fund. (a) There is
- 14 established the state sustainability special fund, into which
- 15 shall be deposited the following moneys:
- 16 (1) Investment earnings, gifts, donations, or other income
- received by the office of sustainability;
- 18 (2) Any rebates, grants, or incentives associated with
- sustainability measures; and
- 20 (3) Capital appropriations for sustainability measures.

T	(d)	Moneys in the state sustainability special fund shall
2	be used to	support:
3	(1)	The work and operations of the office of
4		sustainability; and
5	(2)	Sustainability initiatives, projects, and services.
6	(c)	The department of business, economic development, and
7	tourism sh	all adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 to
8	implement	this section."
9	SECTI	ON 4. There is appropriated out of the general
10	revenues c	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much
11	thereof as	may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to be
12	deposited	into the state sustainability special fund.
13	SECTI	ON 5. There is appropriated out of the state
14	sustainabi	lity special fund the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much
15	thereof as	may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to:
16	(1)	Establish and hire a full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE)
17		director of the office of sustainability position
18	,	pursuant to this Act; provided that the sustainability
19		coordinator position shall be transferred from the
20		office of planning;

1	(2)	Establish and hire one full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE)
2		sustainability planning administrator position;
3		provided that the position may be added to the
4		position count for the department of business,
5		economic development, and tourism;
6	(3)	Establish and fill four full-time equivalent (4.00
7		FTE) planner V positions; provided that the positions
8		may be added to the position count for the department
9		of business, economic development, and tourism;
10	(4)	Establish and fill one full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE)
11		secretary III position; provided that the position may
12		be added to the position count for the department of
13		business, economic development, and tourism; and
14	(5)	Establish and operate the office of sustainability.
15	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
16	business,	economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
17	this Act.	
18	SECT	ION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 28, 2045.
