

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTORCYCLES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to part V to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 Driving on designated shoulder; two-wheeled "§291C-5 motorcycles. (a) The department of transportation, in its sole discretion, may designate one or more shoulders upon which the 6 7 department of transportation may authorize the driving of two-8 wheeled motorcycles; provided that: 9 (1) Any shoulder so designated shall be the shoulder of a 10 roadway with at least two lanes for vehicular traffic moving in the same direction; 11 12 The department of transportation shall not authorize: (2) Drivers of two-wheeled motorcycles to maneuver 13 (A)14 their vehicles onto a shoulder unless vehicular 15 traffic on the roadway is stopped for no less minutes, or a longer time as designated 16 than 17 by an official traffic-control device, as a

1		result of a marked or unmarked intersection or		
2		congestion;		
3		(B) The driving of two-wheeled motorcycles upon a		
4		shoulder:		
5		(i) At any speed exceeding ten miles per hour;		
6		<u>or</u>		
7		(ii) In a direction other than the direction of		
8		vehicular traffic in the adjacent roadway;		
9		<u>or</u>		
10		(C) Drivers of two-wheeled motorcycles to make any		
11		turn from any shoulder;		
12	(3)	The department of transportation may impose additional		
13		restrictions on the maneuvering and driving of two-		
14		wheeled motorcycles onto and on designated shoulders,		
15		including restrictions that are more stringent than		
16		those described in paragraph (2); and		
17	(4)	The department of transportation shall clearly mark		
18		any designated shoulder with appropriate official		
19		traffic-control devices, including traffic-control		
20		devices that indicate the:		

1		(A) Points along the shoulder at which two-wheeled
2		motorcycles may begin to enter the shoulder and
3		shall begin to exit the shoulder; and
4		(B) Maximum speed at which two-wheeled motorcycles
5		may be driven in the shoulder.
6	(b)	The following conditions shall apply to any driver of
7	a two-whee	eled motorcycle maneuvering onto or driving on a
8	shoulder s	specifically designated by the department of
9	transport	ation pursuant to subsection (a):
10	(1)	The driver shall not maneuver the motorcycle onto a
11		designated shoulder until vehicular traffic on the
12		roadway has been stopped for no less than
13		minutes, or a longer time as designated by an official
14		traffic-control device, as a result of a marked or
15		unmarked intersection or congestion;
16	(2)	Unless otherwise prohibited by an official traffic-
17		control device, the driver may traverse lanes on the
18		roadway to the extent necessary to maneuver the
19		motorcycle onto the designated shoulder; provided that
20		the driver shall yield to oncoming traffic when other
21		vehicles on the roadway begin to move forward;

1	(3)	The driver shall not make any turn from the shoulder;					
2	(4)	Subject to paragraph (5), the driver shall exit the					
3		shoulder:					
4		(A) When vehicles in the adjacent traffic lane that					
5		the driver was previously using begin to move					
6		forward; or					
7		(B) At any point so designated by an official					
8		traffic-control device;					
9	(5)	When exiting the shoulder, the driver shall yield to					
10		oncoming traffic and maneuver the driver's vehicle					
11		completely into the adjacent lane as soon as it is					
12		safe to do so;					
13	(6)	The driver shall use turn signals provided for in					
14		section 291C-85 while entering, exiting, or driving					
15		upon a shoulder in the same manner that the driver					
16		would be required to use the signals while driving in					
17		or changing lanes; and					
18	(7)	The driver shall obey all other traffic laws and					
19		official traffic-control devices."					
20	SECT	ION 2. Section 291C-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
21	amended t	o read as follows:					

1	" [-[]	§291C-43[] Overtaking a vehicle on the left. The
2	following	rules shall govern the overtaking and passing of
3	vehicles	proceeding in the same direction, subject to those
4	limitatio	ns, exceptions, and special rules hereinafter stated:
5	(1)	The driver of a vehicle overtaking another vehicle
6		proceeding in the same direction shall pass to the
7		left thereof at a safe distance and shall not again
8		drive to the right side of the roadway until safely
9		clear of the overtaken vehicle $[-]$ ;
10	(2)	Except when overtaking and passing on the right is
11		permitted, the driver of an overtaken vehicle shall
12		give way to the right in favor of the overtaking
13		vehicle on audible signal and shall not increase the
14		speed of the driver's vehicle until completely passed
15		by the overtaking vehicle[-]; and
16	(3)	The driver of a two-wheeled motorcycle may overtake a
17		stopped vehicle by maneuvering onto and driving on a
18		designated shoulder in a manner pursuant to section
19		291C- (b)."
20	SECT	TION 3. Section 291C-44, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amandad h	or amonding subscation (a) to read as follows:

1	"(a)	The driver of a vehicle may overtake and pass upon
2	the right	of another vehicle only under the following
3	conditions	5:
4	(1)	When the vehicle overtaken is making or about to make
5		a left turn;
6	(2)	Upon a street or highway with unobstructed pavement
7		not occupied by parked vehicles of sufficient width
8		for and with lanes marked for two or more lines of
9		moving vehicles in each direction;
10	(3)	Upon a one-way street, or upon any roadway on which
11		traffic is restricted to one direction of movement,
12		where the roadway is free from obstructions and of
13		sufficient width for two or more lines of moving
14		vehicles[-]; or
15	(4)	When the driver of a two-wheeled motorcycle overtakes
16		a stopped vehicle by maneuvering onto and driving on a
17		designated shoulder in a manner pursuant to section
18		291C- (b)."
19	SECT	ION 4. Section 291C-49, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	amended t	o read as follows:

- 2 Whenever any roadway has been divided into two or more clearly
- 3 marked lanes for traffic the following rules in addition to all
- 4 others consistent herewith shall apply [-]:
  - (1) A vehicle shall be driven as nearly as practicable entirely within a single lane and shall not be moved from the lane until the driver has first ascertained that such movement can be made with safety[-];
- Upon a roadway which is divided into three lanes and 9 (2) provides for two-way movement of traffic, a vehicle 10 shall not be driven in the center lane except when 11 overtaking and passing another vehicle traveling in 12 the same direction when the center lane is clear of 13 traffic within a safe distance, or in preparation for 14 making a left turn or where the center lane is at the 15 time allocated exclusively to traffic moving in the 16 same direction that the vehicle is proceeding and such 17 allocation is designated by official traffic-control 18 19 devices[-];
- (3) Official traffic-control devices may be erected
  directing specified traffic to use a designated lane

1		or designating those lanes to be used by traffic	
2		moving in a particular direction regardless of the	
3		center of the roadway and drivers of vehicles shall	
4		obey the directions of every such [sign.] device; and	
5	(4)	Official traffic-control devices may be installed	
6		prohibiting the changing of lanes on sections of	
7		roadway and drivers of vehicles shall obey the	
8		directions of every such device [-];	
9	provided	that this section shall not be construed to prohibit	
10	the maneuvering and driving of a two-wheeled motorcycle onto and		
11	on a designated shoulder in a manner pursuant to section		
12	291C- (l	<u>o) .</u> "	
13	SECT	TON 5. Section 291C-125, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
14	amended to read as follows:		
15	"§29	1C-125 Opening and closing vehicle doors[-]:	
16	protrudin	g objects; line of travel. (a) No person shall open	
17	the door	of a motor vehicle on the side available to moving	
18	traffic u	nless and until it is reasonably safe to do so, and can	
19	be done w	vithout interfering with, or causing immediate hazard to	
20	the movem	ent of other traffic, nor shall any person leave a door	
21	open on t	the side of a vehicle available to moving traffic for a	

period of time longer than necessary to load or unload 1 2 passengers. 3 (b) No person shall open a door of a motor vehicle or extend or allow any object to protrude out of or from a motor 4 5 vehicle, or otherwise direct the course and line of travel of a 6 motor vehicle, such that it: Interferes with or obstructs the movement of; or 7 (1) (2) Endangers the lives and safety of the driver or 8 9 passenger of, a two-wheeled motorcycle that is maneuvering onto or driving on 10 a designated shoulder pursuant to section 291C- (b)." 11 SECTION 6. Section 291C-153, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows: 13 The operator of a motorcycle shall not overtake and 14 "(b) pass in the same lane occupied by the vehicle being 15 overtaken[-]; provided that this subsection shall not be 16 construed to prohibit the operator of a two-wheeled motorcycle 17 from traversing lanes for the purpose of maneuvering onto a 18 designated shoulder pursuant to section 291C- (b)(2). 19 (c) No person shall operate a motorcycle between lanes of 20

traffic or between adjacent lines or rows of vehicles [-];

- provided that this subsection shall not be construed to prohibit 1
- 2 the operator of a two-wheeled motorcycle from traversing lanes
- for the purpose of maneuvering onto a designated shoulder 3
- pursuant to section 291C- (b)(2)." 4
- SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 5
- matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 6
- 7 begun before its effective date.
- SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 8
- and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 9
- SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018; 10
- provided that on June 30, 2022, this Act shall be repealed and 11
- sections 291C-43, 291C-44, 291C-49, 291C-125, and 291C-153, 12
- Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which 13
- they read on the day before the effective date of this Act. 14
