A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTORCYCLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1	. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y add	ing a new section to part V to be appropriately
3	designate	d and	to read as follows:
4	" <u>§</u> 29:	1C	Driving on designated shoulder; two-wheeled
5	motorcycl	es.	(a) The department of transportation, in its sole
6	discretion	n, ma	y designate one or more shoulders upon which the
7	department	t of	transportation may authorize the driving of two-
8	wheeled mo	otorc	ycles; provided that:
9	(1)	Any	shoulder so designated shall be the shoulder of a
10		road	way with at least two lanes for vehicular traffic
11		movi	ng in the same direction;
12	(2)	The	department of transportation shall not authorize:
13		(A)	Drivers of two-wheeled motorcycles to maneuver
14			their vehicles onto a shoulder unless vehicular
15			traffic on the roadway is stopped as a result of
16			a marked or unmarked intersection or congestion;
17		(B)	The driving of two-wheeled motorcycles upon a
18			shoulder:

1		(i) At any speed exceeding ten miles per hour;
2		<u>or</u> ···
3		(ii) In a direction other than the direction of
4		vehicular traffic in the adjacent roadway;
5		<u>or</u>
6		(C) Drivers of two-wheeled motorcycles to make any
7		turn from any shoulder;
8	(3)	The department of transportation may impose additional
9		restrictions on the maneuvering and driving of two-
10		wheeled motorcycles onto and upon designated
11		shoulders, including restrictions that are more
12		stringent than those described in paragraph (2); and
13	(4)	The department of transportation shall clearly mark
14		any designated shoulder with appropriate official
15		traffic-control devices, including traffic-control
16		devices that indicate the:
17		(A) Points along the shoulder at which two-wheeled
18		motorcycles may begin to enter the shoulder and
19		shall begin to exit the shoulder; and
20		(B) Maximum speed at which two-wheeled motorcycles
21		may be driven in the shoulder.

1	(b)	The following conditions shall apply to any driver of
2	a two-whee	eled motorcycle maneuvering onto or driving upon a
3	shoulder	specifically designated by the department of
4	transport	ation pursuant to subsection (a):
5	(1)	The driver shall not maneuver the motorcycle onto a
6		designated shoulder until vehicular traffic on the
7		roadway has been stopped as a result of a marked or
8		unmarked intersection or congestion;
9	(2)	Unless otherwise prohibited by an official traffic-
10		control device, the driver may traverse lanes on the
11		roadway to the extent necessary to maneuver the
12		motorcycle onto the designated shoulder; provided that
13		the driver shall yield to oncoming traffic when other
14		vehicles on the roadway begin to move forward;
15	(3)	The driver shall not make any turn from the shoulder;
16	(4)	Subject to paragraph (5), the driver shall exit the
17		shoulder:
18		(A) When vehicles in the adjacent traffic lane that
19		the driver was previously using begin to move
20		forward; or

1		(B) At any point so designated by an official	
2		traffic-control device;	
3	<u>(5)</u>	When exiting the shoulder, the driver shall yield to	
4		oncoming traffic and maneuver the driver's vehicle	
5		completely into the adjacent lane as soon as it is	
6		safe to do so;	
7	<u>(6)</u>	The driver shall use turn signals provided for in	
8		section 291C-85 while entering, exiting, or driving	
9		upon a shoulder in the same manner that the driver	
10		would be required to use the signals while driving in	
11		or changing lanes; and	
12	(7)	The driver shall obey all other traffic laws and	
13		official traffic-control devices."	
14	SECT	ION 2. Section 291C-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
15	amended to read as follows:		
16	"[+]§291C-43[+] Overtaking a vehicle on the left. The		
17	following	rules shall govern the overtaking and passing of	
18	vehicles	proceeding in the same direction, subject to those	
19	limitatio	ns, exceptions, and special rules hereinafter stated:	
20	(1)	The driver of a vehicle overtaking another vehicle	
21		proceeding in the same direction shall pass to the

12	traffic unless and until it is reasonably safe to do so, and car

14	the movement of other traffic, nor shall any person leave a door
15	open on the side of a vehicle available to moving traffic for a
16	period of time longer than necessary to load or unload
17	passengers.
18	(b) No person shall open a door of a motor vehicle or
19	extend or allow any object to protrude out of or from a motor
20	vehicle, or otherwise direct the course and line of travel of a

motor vehicle, such that it:

1	(1) Interferes with or obstructs the movement of; or
2	(2) Endangers the lives and safety of the driver or
3	passenger of,

6	SECTION 6. Section 291C-153, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:
8	"(b) The operator of a motorcycle shall not overtake and
9	pass in the same lane occupied by the vehicle being
10	overtaken[+]; provided that this subsection shall not be
11	construed to prohibit the operator of a two-wheeled motorcycle
12	from traversing lanes for the purpose of maneuvering onto a
13	designated shoulder pursuant to section 291C- (b)(2).
14	(c) No person shall operate a motorcycle between lanes of
15	traffic or between adjacent lines or rows of vehicles [-];
16	provided that this subsection shall not be construed to prohibit
17	the operator of a two-wheeled motorcycle from traversing lanes
18	for the purpose of maneuvering onto a designated shoulder
19	pursuant to section 291C- (b)(2)."

- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2019;
- 7 provided that on December 31, 2020, this Act shall be repealed
- 8 and sections 291C-43, 291C-44, 291C-49, 291C-125, and 291C-153,
