A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FERAL CATS.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that feral cats are non-

2 domesticated cats that typically live outdoors in colonies with

3 other feral cats. The fact that feral cats have not been

4 socialized to interact with humans makes it impractical to place

5 them into adoptive homes. Feral cat colonies create numerous

6 problems for the cats themselves, as well as for as the

7 communities that find their presence to be a nuisance.

8 The legislature also finds that feral cats can reproduce at

an alarming rate. It is estimated that one unspayed female cat

and her unaltered offspring can produce more than four hundred

thousand cats within seven years. Although counties may attempt

12 to control the feral cat population by euthanizing feral cats,

13 euthanasia does not address the problem of exponential increases

14 in the cat population. When cats from a colony are euthanized,

15 they leave a vacuum that is filled when other unsterilized cats

16 enter the same colony and start reproducing.

1	The legislature further finds that the trap-sterilize-
2	return process is not only more humane than euthanization, but
3	less costly. In the trap-sterilize-return process, feral cats
4	are caught in humane traps, sterilized so that they can no
5	longer reproduce, and surgically ear-tipped or ear-notched on
6	one ear so that they may be easily identified as sterilized.
7	The process may also include removing fleas and vaccinating the
8	cats. When these sterilized cats are returned to their
9	colonies, unsterilized cats are less likely to take their place.
10	Thus, with the trap-sterilize-return process, colony populations
11	can reduce gradually over time.
12	The purpose of this Act is to promote the humane treatment
13	of feral cats by:
14	(1) Requiring to contract with a nonprofit animal
15	rescue group to oversee caretakers of feral cats;
16	(2) Exempting registered caretakers of feral cats from
17	state and county laws relating to the feeding and
18	confinement of cats; provided that the caretakers are
19	registered with the contracted rescue group; and
20	(3) Establishing a feral cat trap-sterilize-return
21	process.

1	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	FERAL CATS
6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
7	context clearly requires otherwise:
8	"Caretaker" means a person who provides or attempts to
9	provide food and care to one or more feral cats within the
10	State.
11	"Colony" means a group of feral cats that congregate and
12	live together at a location within the State.
13	"Contracted rescue group" means the rescue group that has
14	entered into a contract with pursuant to this chapter.
15	"Feral cat" means a cat that is not:
16	(1) Owned by any person, or has been abandoned by its
17	owner; or
18	(2) Confined by any person to any real property.
19	"Registered caretaker" means a person who is registered as
20	a caretaker pursuant to this chapter.

"Rescue group" means a society or organization that:

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T	(1)	is incorporated and in good standing as a nonprofit
2		corporation pursuant to chapter 414D;
3	(2)	Is incorporated for the purpose of providing shelter
4		to animals, promoting animal welfare, preventing
5		cruelty to animals, or a substantially similar
6		purpose;
7	(3)	Euthanizes or arranges to euthanize an animal only
8		after a licensed veterinarian has determined that:
9		(A) The animal is suffering from an injury, terminal
10		illness, or other health problem that severely
11		affects the animal's quality of life; and
12		(B) Euthanization is necessary to alleviate the
13		animal's suffering; and
14	(4)	Is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a tax
15		exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the
16		Internal Revenue Code.
17	"Tra	p-sterilize-return process" means a process that
18	includes	capturing a feral cat, arranging for its sterilization,
19	complying	with other applicable standards, and subsequently
20	releasing	the cat.

1.	\$	-2 Contracted rescue group responsibilities. By
2	January 1	, , shall contract with a rescue group
3	to:	
4	(1)	Register caretakers of feral cats;
5	(2)	Maintain records of the names and contact information
6		of registered caretakers;
7	(3)	Submit an annual report to that includes, at
8		a minimum:
9		(A) The number of registered caretakers;
10		(B) The number of feral cats captured by registered
11		caretakers;
12		(C) The location of each known colony; and
13		(D) An estimate of the number of feral cats in each
14		known colony that have been sterilized;
15	(4)	Instruct and provide informational materials to each
16		registered caretaker regarding the care of feral cats
17		and the trap-sterilize-return process;
18	(5)	Distribute humane feral cat traps to registered
19		caretakers at no cost or at a reasonable cost;
20	(6)	Monitor registered caretakers' compliance with this
)1		chapter and any rules adopted under this shapter.

1	(7)	Revoke the registration of any caretaker who fails to
2		comply with this chapter or any rules adopted under
3		this chapter; and
4	(8)	Develop and distribute information and plan events to
5		educate the general public on the care of feral cats
6		and the trap-sterilize-return process.
7	§	-3 Registered caretaker privileges. Notwithstanding
8	any other	law to the contrary, a registered caretaker shall be
9	exempt fr	om any state law or county ordinance that:
10	(1)	Prohibits or requires a permit for the feeding of
11		stray animals;
12	(2)	Mandates the confinement of cats; or
13	(3)	Limits the number of animals that a person may own,
14		harbor, or have custody of;
15	provided	that this section shall not be construed to limit the
16	enforceme	ent of any law or ordinance prohibiting cruelty to
17	animals i	if enforcement is not solely based on the fact that the

3	(9)	Maintain a log of the number of cats the caretaker has
4		caused to complete the trap-sterilize-return process,
5		and submit a copy of the log to the contracted rescue
6		group not less than once monthly;
7	provided	that a caretaker shall not be required to comply with
8	paragraph	s (5) through (7) if compliance is cost-prohibitive.
9	(b)	A registered caretaker shall be exempt from any
10	requireme	nt of subsection (a) if the requirement would adversely
11	affect th	e health of a feral cat or if a licensed veterinarian
12	determine	s that a feral cat should be euthanized because:
13	(1)	The animal is suffering from an injury, illness, or
14		other health problem that severely affects the
15		animal's quality of life; and
16	(2)	Euthanization is necessary to alleviate the animal's
17		suffering.
18	(c)	A registered caretaker shall comply with:
19	(1)	This chapter and rules adopted under this chapter; and
20	(2)	All state laws and county ordinances that prohibit
21		cruelty to animals.

Feral Cats; Sterilization; Animal Rescue Group

Description:

Requires an unspecified state agency to contract with a nonprofit animal rescue group to oversee caretakers of feral cats. Exempts registered caretakers of feral cats from state laws and county ordinances relating to the feeding and confinement of cats. Establishes a trap-sterilize-return process. (HB2593 HD1)

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
