## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FERAL CATS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that free-roaming cats
- 2 are a diverse population that can include abandoned and lost
- 3 pets, owned cats allowed outdoors, and the offspring of these
- 4 cats. Feral cats, a subset of this population, are not
- 5 socialized and are unaccustomed to interacting with people.
- 6 Although counties may attempt to control the free-roaming cat
- 7 population by euthanizing cats, euthanasia does not address the
- 8 problem of exponential increases in the cat population.
- 9 The legislature further finds that the trap-sterilize-
- 10 return-manage process is not only more humane than euthanasia,
- 11 but less costly. In the trap-sterilize-return-manage process,
- 12 free-roaming cats are caught in humane traps, sterilized so that
- 13 they can no longer reproduce, microchipped, and surgically ear-
- 14 tipped or ear-notched on one ear so that they may be easily
- 15 identified as sterilized. The management process includes
- 16 regularly providing food and water, monitoring the cats,
- 17 sterilizing any cats in the colony, removing any kittens or



1	socialize	d cats for assessment and potential adoption, and
2	providing	care to ill or injured cats, including euthanasia if
3	deemed ne	cessary. When these sterilized cats are returned to
4	their col	onies, unsterilized cats are less likely to take their
5	place. T	hus, with the trap-sterilize-return-manage process,
6	coupled w	ith identifying and evaluating new arrivals for
7	placement	in homes, colony populations can reduce gradually over
8	time thro	ugh attrition and removal for adoption.
9	The	purpose of this Act is to promote the humane treatment
10	of free-r	oaming cats by:
11	(1)	Allowing nonprofit animal care or rescue groups to
12		register and oversee caregivers of free-roaming cats
13		in carrying out the trap-sterilize-return-manage
14		process;
15	(2)	Exempting registered caregivers of free-roaming cats
16		from state and county statutes, ordinances,
17		regulations, rules, or other laws, whether enacted or
18		adopted by the legislature, relevant county council,
19		or other state or county government agency or entity,

relating to the feeding and confinement of cats; and

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1	(3)	Establishing a free-roaming cat trap-sterilize-return-
2		manage process.
3	SECT	ION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
4	adding a	new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
5	as follow	5:
6		"CHAPTER
7		FREE-ROAMING CATS
8	S	-1 <b>Definitions.</b> As used in this chapter, unless the
9	context c	learly requires otherwise:
10	"Aniı	mal care or rescue group" means a society or
11	organizat:	ion that:
12	(1)	Is incorporated and in good standing as a nonprofit
13		corporation pursuant to chapter 414D, Hawaii Revised
14		Statutes;
15	(2)	Is incorporated for the purpose of providing shelter
16		to animals; promoting, advancing or otherwise
17		facilitating animal welfare; preventing cruelty to
18		animals; or a substantially similar purpose; and
19	(3)	Is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a tax
20		exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the
21		Internal Revenue Code.

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- 1 "Caregiver" means a person who assists with the management
- 2 of a colony by sterilizing and providing food, water, and care
- 3 to one or more free-roaming cats within the State.
- 4 "Colony" means a group of free-roaming cats that congregate
- 5 and live together at a location within the State.
- 6 "Registered caregiver" means a person who is registered as
- 7 a caregiver with an animal care or rescue group pursuant to this
- 8 chapter.
- 9 "Trap-sterilize-return-manage process" means a process that
- 10 includes humanely capturing a free-roaming cat, arranging for
- 11 its sterilization, complying with other applicable standards set
- 12 forth in this chapter, and subsequently releasing the cat back
- 13 to its original location if appropriate.
- 14 § -2 Animal care or rescue group responsibilities. An
- 15 animal care or rescue group may register caregivers of free-
- 16 roaming cats; provided that the animal care or rescue group
- 17 shall:
- 18 (1) Maintain records of the names and contact information
- of registered caregivers;
- 20 (2) Submit an annual report to the senate standing
- 21 committee and the house of representatives standing

1		committee whose purviews include agriculture that
2		includes, at a minimum:
3		(A) The number of registered caregivers;
4		(B) The number of free-roaming cats captured by
5		registered caregivers and dispositions of the
6		free-roaming cats;
7		(C) The number of known colonies managed by
8		registered caregivers; and
9		(D) The number of free-roaming cats in each known
10		colony and the number that have been sterilized;
11	(3)	Instruct and provide informational materials to each
12		registered caregiver regarding the care of free-
13		roaming cats and the trap-sterilize-return-manage
14		process;
15	(4)	Distribute humane cat traps to registered caregivers
16		at no cost or at a reasonable cost;
17	(5)	Make reasonable efforts to monitor registered
18		caregivers' compliance with this chapter;
19	(6)	Revoke the registration of any caregiver who is known
20		to fail to comply with this chapter;

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1	(7)	Develop and distribute information and plan events to
2		educate the general public on the care of free-roaming
3		cats and the trap-sterilize-return-manage process; and
4	(8)	Make reasonable efforts to mediate and resolve
5		concerns regarding the presence of a known colony
6		managed by a registered caregiver on or immediately
7		adjacent to property managed by a federal, state, or
8		county agency for the primary purpose of protection of
9		wildlife. The relevant agency shall address all
10		concerns directly and in writing to the animal care or
11		rescue group. The animal care or rescue group shall
12		consider reasonable steps to reduce any adverse
13		impacts to wildlife.
14	S	-3 Registered caregiver exemptions. Notwithstanding
15	any other	law to the contrary, a registered caregiver shall be
16	exempt fr	om any state or county statute, ordinance, regulation,
17	rule, or	other law that:
18	(1)	Prohibits the feeding or care of stray cats or
19		requires a permit to do so;
20	(2)	Mandates the confinement of cats; or

1	(3) Limits the number of cats that a person may own,
2	harbor, or have custody of;
3	provided that this section shall not be construed to limit the
4	enforcement of any law or ordinance requiring the sterilization
5	of cats or prohibiting cruelty to animals. Enforcement of any
6	law or ordinance prohibiting cruelty to animals shall not be
7	based solely on the registered caregiver feeding or otherwise
8	caring for free-roaming cats in a public or private location.
9	§ -4 Registered caregiver responsibilities; trap-
10	sterilize-return-manage process. A registered caregiver who
11	elects to participate in the trap-sterilize-return-manage
12	process shall:
13	(1) On an annual basis, provide the following information
14	to the animal care or rescue group with whom the
15	caregiver is registered:
16	(A) Name and contact information;
17	(B) Location of each known colony under the
18	caregivers' care;
19	(C) The number of free-roaming cats captured by the
20	caregiver and the treatment received by each cat
21	by colony; and

1		(D) The number of free-roaming cats in each known
2		colony and the number in each known colony that
3		have been sterilized;
4	(2)	Make reasonable efforts to ensure all free-roaming
5		cats under the caregiver's care are sterilized,
6		microchipped, and ear tipped or notched; provided that
7		the caregiver is not responsible for microchipping or
8		ear tipping or notching cats that were sterilized
9		prior to the date of registration of the caregiver;
10	(3)	Make reasonable efforts to remove socialized kittens
11		and socialized cats for adoptive placement;
12	(4)	Make reasonable efforts to provide veterinary medical
13		care for animals suffering from illness or injury;
14		provided that a registered caregiver shall be exempt
15		from this paragraph if the requirement would adversely
16		affect the health of a free-roaming cat or if a
17		licensed veterinarian determines that a free-roaming
18		cat should be euthanized because:
19		(A) The animal is suffering from an injury, illness,
20		or other health problem that severely affects the
21		animal's quality of life; and

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1	(B) Euthanasia is necessary to alleviate the animal's
2	suffering; and
3	(5) Comply with this chapter and all state laws and county
4	ordinances that prohibit cruelty to animals."
5	SECTION 3. An animal care or rescue group who registers
6	caregivers of free-roaming cats shall submit a report of its
7	findings and recommendations, including any proposed
8	legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
9	to the convening of the regular session of 2023. The report
10	shall include a five-year summary of the following data:
11	(1) The number of registered caregivers;
12	(2) The number of free-roaming cats captured by registered
13	caregivers and the dispositions of those free-roaming
14	cats;
15	(3) The number of known colonies managed by registered
16	caregivers; and
17	(4) The number of free-roaming cats in each known colony
18	and the number that have been sterilized.
19	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2018,
20	and shall be repealed on December 31, 2022.

#### Report Title:

Free-roaming Cats; Trap-sterilize-return-manage; Animal Care or Rescue Group

### Description:

Allows a nonprofit animal care or rescue group to register and oversee caregivers of free-roaming cats. Exempts registered caregivers of free-roaming cats from state laws and county ordinances relating to the feeding and confinement of cats. Establishes a trap-sterilize-return-manage process. Takes effect on 1/1/2018. Repeals on 12/31/2022. (SD1)

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
