# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that traffic congestion 2 is a serious problem that negatively affects the quality of life 3 for residents and visitors in Hawaii. Congestion on the State's 4 roadways continues to increase, forcing people to spend more 5 time sitting in vehicles and less time being productive at work 6 or with families and friends.

7 The legislature also finds that visitors make up a large8 proportion of public highway users.

9 The legislature believes that it is prudent to target this 10 group of highway users to raise revenue for capital improvements 11 to Hawaii's highways, which will relieve congestion and improve 12 the quality of life for both residents and visitors.

13 The purpose of this Act is to use additional fees from the 14 rental of motor vehicles to fund projects to increase highway 15 capacity and relieve traffic congestion.

16 Specifically, this Act:



1	(1)	Increases the rental motor vehicle surcharge tax for
2		lessees without a valid Hawaii driver's license by \$2
3		for each day, or portion of a day, that a rental motor
4		vehicle is rented;
5	(2)	Requires that the revenues from the increase in motor
6		vehicle surcharge tax be expended for state highway
7		road capacity projects in the county in which the
8		rental motor vehicle was operated under the rental or
9		lease agreement; and
10	(3)	Increases the tour vehicle surcharge tax by \$1 for
11		each category of tour vehicle.
12	SECT	ION 2. Section 248-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended t	o read as follows:
14	"§24	8-9 State highway fund. (a) Moneys in the state
15	highway f	und may be expended for the following purposes:
16	(1)	To pay the costs of operation, maintenance, and repair
17		of the state highway system, including without
18		limitation, the cost of equipment and general
19		administrative overhead;
20	(2)	To pay the costs of acquisition (including real
21		property and interests therein), planning, designing,

3		the cost of equipment and general administrative

5	(3)	To reimburse the general fund for interest on and
6		principal of general obligation bonds issued to
7		finance highway projects where the bonds are
8		designated to be reimbursable out of the state highway
9		fund; and
10	(4)	To pay the costs of construction, maintenance, and
11		repair of county roads; provided that none of the
12		funds expended on a county road or program shall be
13		federal funds when such expenditure would cause a
14		violation of federal law or a federal grant agreement.
15	(b)	At any time, the director of transportation may
16	transfer	from the state highway fund all or any portion of
17	available	moneys determined by the director of transportation to
18	exceed on	e hundred thirty-five per cent of the requirements for
19	the ensui	ng twelve months for the state highway fund as
20	permitted	by and in accordance with section 37-53. For purposes

3	(1)	The amount of federal funds and bond funds on deposit

18	leased[-]; provided that lessees without a valid Hawaii driver's		
19	license shall be assessed an additional \$2 a day, or any portion

1 lessor; provided that the tax shall not be levied on the lessor 2 if: 3 (1) The lessor is renting the vehicle to replace a vehicle 4 of the lessee that is being repaired; and 5 (2) A record of the repair order for the vehicle is 6 retained either by the lessor for two years for 7 verification purposes or by a motor vehicle repair 8 dealer for two years as provided in section 437B-16. 9 In addition to the requirements imposed by section 251-4, a 10 lessor shall disclose, to the department, the portion of the 11 remittance attributed to the county in which the motor vehicle 12 was operated under rental or lease. 13 Of the remittances collected pursuant to this subsection, 14 \$2 per day or portion of a day from each lessee without a valid 15 Hawaii driver's license shall be deposited into the state 16 treasury to the credit of the respective county subaccount of 17 the state highway fund, established pursuant to section 248-18 9(c), that corresponds to the county in which the rental motor 19 vehicle was driven under rental or lease. 20 (b) There is levied and shall be assessed and collected

21 each month a tour vehicle surcharge tax of:

1 (1) [<del>\$65</del>] \$66 for each tour vehicle used or partially used 2 during the month that falls into the over twenty-five 3 passenger seat category; and (2) [\$15] \$16 for each tour vehicle used or partially used 4 during the month that falls into the eight to twenty-5 6 five passenger seat category. 7 The tour vehicle surcharge tax shall be levied upon the 8 tour vehicle operator." SECTION 4. Section 251-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 10 amended to read as follows: "§251-5 Remittances. All remittances of surcharge taxes 11 12 imposed under this chapter shall be made by cash, bank draft, 13 cashier's check, money order, or certificate of deposit to the office of the taxation district to which the return was 14 transmitted. The department shall deposit the moneys into the 15 16 state treasury to the credit of the state highway fund [-]; 17 provided that user fee revenues that are levied, assessed, and collected pursuant to section 251-2(a) from lessees without a 18 valid Hawaii drivers license shall be deposited in accordance 19 with section 248-9(c)." 20

3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2019.



Report Title:

Rental Motor Vehicle Surcharge; Tour Vehicle Surcharge; State Highway Fund; State Highway Road Capacity Projects

#### Description:

Increases the rental motor vehicle surcharge from \$3 to \$5 for lessees without a valid Hawaii driver's license from the rental motor vehicle surcharge. Requires that the revenues from the increase in motor vehicle surcharge tax be expended for state highway road capacity projects in the county in which the rental motor vehicle was operated under rental or lease. Increases the tour vehicle surcharge by \$1 for each category of tour vehicle. Effective 1/1/2019. (SD2)
