### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ALA WAI BOAT HARBOR.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Act 197, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, is
  amended by amending section 8 to read as follows:

  "SECTION 8. (a) Pursuant to section 200-2.5, Hawaii

	with moorage fees to be determined by the

17	Statutes,	the prior authorization of the legislature by
18	concurren	t resolution shall not be required for the lease of
19	submerged	lands and lands beneath tidal waters at the Ala Wai

boat harbor."
