A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CESSPOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Chapter 342D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended by adding two new sections to part IV to be
4	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
5	"§342D-A Advisory council; cesspool conversion. (a) The
6	cesspool conversion advisory council is established and shall be
7	attached to the department of health for administrative purposes
8	only. The advisory council shall investigate issues relating to
9	the upgrade or conversion of a cesspool to a septic system or
10	aerobic treatment unit system, or the connection of cesspools to
11	a sewerage system or other approved wastewater treatment system
12	(to be referred to collectively as "cesspool conversion"), as
13	required by January 1, 2050, pursuant to Act 125, Session Laws
14	of Hawaii 2017 (Act 125). Specifically, the advisory council
15	shall:
16	(1) Develop criteria to prioritize the conversion of
17	cesspools, based on the severity of risk of adverse

1		human health or environmental impacts, including
2		impacts to drinking water, groundwater, coastal water,
3		and coral reef ecosystems;
4	(2)	Identify areas where data is insufficient to determine
5		a priority classification of cesspools for conversion
6		and determine methods and resources needed to obtain
7		and collect the data; and
8	(3)	Develop a long-range comprehensive plan for cesspool
9		conversion statewide to be known as the cesspool
10		conversion plan.
11	(b)	The cesspool conversion advisory council shall develop
12	a long-ra	nge comprehensive plan for cesspool conversion
13	statewide	to be known as the cesspool conversion plan which may
14	include a	ny combination of the following:
15	(1)	Grant programs;
16	(2)	Loan programs;
17	(3)	<pre>Tax credits;</pre>
18	(4)	Fees;
19	(5)	Special assessment districts;
20	(6)	Requirements for conversion at point of sale: or

1	(7)	Other appropriate mechanisms for accomplishing and
2		funding cesspool conversions.
3	(c)	In developing the cesspool conversion plan, the
4	advisory	council shall consider:
5	(1)	A timeline for cesspool conversion and determine
6		whether conversion of the highest priority cesspools
7		should take place prior to January 1, 2050;
8	(2)	Granting exemptions from mandatory conversion based
9 ·		upon geology, topography, soil type, availability of
10		land, or other relevant factors;
11	(3)	Alternative wastewater technologies, such as gray
12		water systems, constructed wetlands, and other
13		available technologies, and how these technologies can
14		be incorporated into part of the long-term solution to
15		wastewater treatment issues;
16	(4)	Measures to encourage and stimulate research and
17		innovation for new wastewater technologies, including
18		systems that treat waste not only for bacteria but
19		also remove nutrients and contaminants that impact the
20		environment;
21	(5)	Best practices in other jurisdictions;

1	(6)	The ability of homeowners to pay for cesspool
2		conversions and mechanisms to provide financial
3		assistance to lower-income homeowners; and
4	(7)	Sources of funding for the cesspool conversion plan,
5		including state and county funds, federal grants or
6		loans, fees, real property taxes, the creation of
7		special assessment districts, and any combination of
8		funding sources that will best facilitate cesspool
9		conversion by January 1, 2050, as required under Act
10		125.
11	(d)	The advisory council shall complete the cesspool
12	conversio	n plan by December 31, 2019. If the department
13	approves	of the plan, the advisory council shall:
14	(1)	Monitor its implementation and report its findings to
15		the department; and
16	(2)	Recommend any necessary rule changes to the director
17		of health and any necessary statutory changes to the
18		legislature.
19	<u>(e)</u>	The advisory council shall consist of the following ex

1	(1)	The deputy director for the department of health,
2		environmental health administration, or the deputy
3		director's designee, who shall serve as the chair of
4		the advisory council;
5	(2)	The city and county of Honolulu director of
6		environmental services or designee;
7	(3)	The county of Hawaii director of environmental
8		management or designee;
9	(4)	The county of Kauai county engineer or designee;
10	(5)	The county of Maui director of environmental
11		management or designee; and
12	(6)	A county director of finance, who shall be appointed
13		by the Hawaii Council of Mayors.
14	<u>(f)</u>	In addition to the ex officio members described in
15	subsectio	n (e), the chair of the advisory council shall appoint
16	the follo	wing persons as members of the advisory council:
17	(1)	A representative from the clean water branch of the
18		department of health, environmental health
19		administration, environmental management division;
20	(2)	A representative from the department of land and
21		natural resources, aquatic resources division;

1	(3) A representative from the University of Hawaii at
2	Manoa, Hawaii institute of marine biology; and
3	(4) A wastewater industry expert, who shall serve as vice-
4	chair of the advisory council.
5	(g) Advisory council members may recommend additional
6	members with appropriate specialized expertise to the advisory
7	council, for approval by the chair.
8	(h) The advisory council may contract for research
9	services, without regard to chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised
10	Statutes, that are necessary for the advisory council to carry
11	out its duties under this section.
12	(i) Members of the advisory council shall be exempt from
13	section 26-34 and shall serve without compensation, but shall be
14	reimbursed for reasonable expenses necessary for the performance
15	of their duties, including travel expenses.
16	(j) The advisory council may hold informational briefings
17	or public meetings in each county, as deemed necessary, to
18	gather input from the public on issues related to cesspool
19	conversion.
20	(k) The advisory council shall submit annual reports,
21	including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later

1	than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session,
2	beginning with the regular session of 2019.
3	(1) The department of health shall provide administrative
4	and clerical support required by the advisory council.
5	§342D-B Cesspool compliance pilot grant project. (a)
6	There is established in the department the cesspool compliance
7	pilot grant project to assist owners of real property with a
8	cesspool that the department has assigned to priority level one
9	in the department's December 2017 report to the legislature
10	relating to cesspools and prioritization for replacement, which
11	was prepared in response to Act 125, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017
12	(cesspools report). Specifically, the pilot project will assist
13	the owners in meeting the costs of:
14	(1) Upgrading or converting a cesspool to a septic system,
15	aerobic treatment unit system, or other advanced
16	treatment system approved by the department; or
17	(2) Connecting a cesspool to a sewerage system.
18	(b) The department shall not grant awards to any owner of
19	real property with a cesspool unless the department has assigned
20	the cesspool to priority level one in the department's cesspools
21	report.

1	<u>(c)</u>	No grant under this section shall be awarded to a
2	property	owner of a cesspool who is:
3	(1)	A taxpayer filing a single return or a married person
4		filing separately with a Hawaii adjusted gross income
5		of \$ or more;
6	(2)	A taxpayer filing as a head of household with a Hawaii
7		adjusted gross income of \$ or more; or
8	(3)	A taxpayer filing a joint return or as a surviving
9		spouse with a Hawaii adjusted gross income of \$
10		or more.
11	<u>(d)</u>	The department shall adopt rules as necessary to carry
12	out the p	pilot grant project; provided that the rules shall
13	include a	a method of calculating a sliding scale grant amount
14	based upo	on the Hawaii adjusted gross income of the owner of the
15	property	with a cesspool.
16	<u>(e)</u>	The department shall terminate the pilot grant project
17	when:	
18	(1)	The cesspool advisory council submits its cesspool
19		conversion plan pursuant to section 342D-A(d); or

1	(2) The department adopts a new project or program that is
2	based upon the recommendations of the cesspool
3	advisory council,
4	whichever occurs first."
5	PART II
6	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
7	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
8	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
9	operational costs of the advisory council established under
10	section 1 of this Act, including the procuring of a contract for
11	any necessary research services.
12	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
13	health for the purposes of this Act.
14	PART III
15	SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
16	1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
17	appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
18	the new sections in this Act.
19	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.

Description:
