## A BILL FOR AN ACT

---

RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSING.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1       SECTION 1.   Section 286-106, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2   amended to read as follows:

3       "§286-106   Expiration of licenses.   Every driver's license  
4   issued under this part, [~~except for a provisional license issued~~  
5   ~~under section 286-102.6 which shall expire on the date of the~~  
6   ~~provisional licensee's nineteenth birthday,~~] whether an original  
7   issuance or a renewal, shall expire on the first birthday of the  
8   licensee occurring not less than eight years after the date of  
9   the issuance of the license, unless sooner revoked or suspended;  
10   provided that:

11       (1)   The license shall expire on the first birthday of the  
12       licensee occurring not less than four years after the  
13       date of the issuance if, at the time, the licensee is  
14       twenty-four years of age or younger;

15       (2)   The license shall expire on the first birthday of the  
16       licensee occurring not less than two years after the  
17       date of the issuance of the license if, at that time,



1 the licensee is seventy-two years of age or older;

2 [and]

3 (3) If the licensee is a legal immigrant, the license  
4 shall expire no later than the licensee's authorized  
5 period of stay in the United States[-]; provided  
6 further that this paragraph shall not apply to a  
7 person who is a citizen of a country having a valid  
8 Compact of Free Association with the United States and  
9 who provides proof of legal presence in the United  
10 States as defined by the director by rule; and

11 (4) This section shall not apply to provisional licenses  
12 issued under section 286-102.6, which shall expire on  
13 the date of the provisional licensee's nineteenth  
14 birthday.

15 The examiner of drivers may issue a license for a shorter  
16 period if the licensee has a physical condition or conditions  
17 that the examiner of drivers reasonably believes may impair the  
18 driver's ability to drive."


19 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

**Report Title:**

Driver's Licensing; COFA Migrants; Expiration of License

**Description:**

Exempts citizens of countries having a valid Compact of Free Association with the United States from the requirement that a driver's license of a legal immigrant expire no later than the legal immigrant's authorized period of stay in the United States. Requires the legal immigrant to provide proof of legal residence in the United States as defined by the Director of Transportation by rule.
