A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that consumption of fresh
fruit and vegetables is an integral part of a healthy diet and
central to the prevention of obesity and disease. Every
community should have adequate access to such healthy dietary
options; however, high cost and poor quality often make this
difficult.

The legislature further finds that, to increase access to 7 fresh fruits and vegetables for beneficiaries of the federal 8 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, some states have 9 enacted farmers' market matching incentive programs. Under such 10 programs, individuals who purchase produce at local farmers' 11 markets using their nutrition assistance benefits receive 12 additional benefits on a dollar-for-dollar basis up to a certain 13 14 amount.

15 The legislature further finds that farmers' market matching 16 incentive programs have not only increased access to healthy 17 dietary options, but have also helped invigorate local economies

and address food insecurity. Previous legislation introduced in 1 Hawaii to establish such a program was supported by community 2 and scientific groups. Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to 3 require the department of agriculture to develop and administer 4 a farmers' market matching incentive program promoting the 5 purchase of Hawaii-grown fruits and vegetables for beneficiaries 6 7 of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program. SECTION 2. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 9 10 and to read as follows: "§141- Farmers market matching incentive program; 11 special fund. (a) There is established a farmers' market 12 matching incentive program for beneficiaries of the Supplemental 13 Nutrition Assistance Program. The program shall be developed 14 and administered by the department of agriculture. 15 (b) Beneficiaries of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance 16 Program who use food stamps to make purchases at a farmers' 17 market shall receive a dollar-for-dollar match up to \$20 to be 18 used exclusively for purchases at a farmers' market. "Farmers' 19 market" shall have the same meaning as in section 20 21 205-2(d)(15)(D).

1	(c) There is established within the department of
2	agriculture a farmers' market matching incentive program special
3	fund, into which shall be deposited any legislative
4	appropriations and any public or private grants, awards, or
5	gifts for the purpose of the farmers' market matching incentive
6	program. Moneys in the special fund may be expended by the
7	department to administer the program and to provide matching
8	funds to beneficiaries.
9	(d) The department of agriculture may cooperate with
10	private organizations to develop rules for the farmers' market
11	matching incentive program."
12	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$300,000 or so much
14	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to be
15	deposited into the farmers' market matching incentive program
16	special fund.
17	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the farmers'
18	market matching incentive program special fund the sum of
19	\$300,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
20	2018-2019 for administration of the farmers' market matching
