A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that plastic scrap is
- 2 highly problematic; it has low economic value, is difficult to
- 3 recycle, and does not easily break down in the environment. For
- 4 over a decade, China has been importing the majority of the
- 5 United States' plastic scrap; however, in July of 2017, China
- 6 announced that it will effectively ban imports on twenty-four
- 7 types of scrap. This has disrupted the global recycling market
- 8 and necessitates that Hawaii continue to innovate and improve to
- 9 find local alternatives to plastics recycling in this changing
- 10 market.
- 11 The legislature further finds that the current redemption
- 12 rate of the deposit beverage container program is 67 per cent,
- down from 78.7 per cent in 2009. The all-time lowest redemption
- 14 rate since the program's inception occurred in 2016 at 66.9 per
- 15 cent. Efforts need to be made to increase the redemption rate
- 16 and ensure that less plastic is being deposited in landfills and
- 17 the ocean.

chapter 91 necessary to effectuate the purposes of this 1 2 section." SECTION 3. Chapter 342G, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 amended by adding two new sections to part VIII to be 4 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 5 "§342G- Redemption benchmarks. No later than January 1, 6 2019, the department shall establish benchmarks to reach a 7 redemption rate of eighty-five per cent by January 1, 2023. 8 §342G- Reporting requirements. The department shall 9 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 10 any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than 11 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session 12 detailing redemption rates, progress, and plans regarding the 13 deposit beverage container program." 14 There is established one full-time equivalent SECTION 4. 15 (1.0 FTE) environmental health specialist IV position and one 16 full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) planner IV position for the 17 advance disposal fee program within the department of health. 18 There is appropriated out of the general 19 SECTION 5. revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$169,466 or so much 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for two 21

- 1 full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions for the glass advance
- 2 disposal fee program, which shall be allocated as follows:
- 3 (1) \$84,733 for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE)
- 4 environmental health specialist IV position; and
- 5 (2) \$84,733 for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) planner
- 6 IV position.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 8 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,000,000 or so much
- 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
- 12 plastics recycling grant program.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 14 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 7. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
