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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

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RELATING TO HEALTH.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1       SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's coral reefs  
2       contribute approximately \$800,000,000 to the State's economy  
3       annually. The State's coral reefs are in decline due to a range  
4       of factors including pathogens, nutrients, cleaning chemicals,  
5       and hydrocarbons discharged from cesspools.

6       The legislature further finds that the Hawaii division of  
7       aquatic resources has reported that the coral reefs at Puako in  
8       the county of Hawaii are in "dire straits." Coral coverage at  
9       Puako has decreased thirty-five per cent and turf and macroalgae  
10      cover has increased thirty-eight per cent over the last thirty  
11      years.

12      The purpose of this Act is to require the department of  
13      health to convene a study group to develop a proposal for a  
14      pilot program to address the contamination relating to waste-  
15      water, cesspools, and shore waters in Puako.

16      SECTION 2. (a) The department of health shall convene the  
17      Puako shore waters study group to provide to the legislature:



(1) A proposal for a pilot program to be conducted by the department of health to address contamination relating to waste-water, cesspools, and shore waters at Puako; and

(2) Any proposed legislation for the purposes of supporting the proposed pilot program.

(b) The Puako shore waters study group shall consist of the following members:

(1) The director of health or the director's designee;

(2) The chair of the senate commerce, consumer protection, and health committee;

(3) The chair of the house of representatives health and human services committee;

(4) The mayor of Hawaii county or a designee;

(5) An individual representing the Coral Alliance; and

(6) An individual from the Puako Community Association.

(c) The department of health shall provide research, clerical, and technical support for the study group.

(d) The Puako shore waters study group shall elect one of its members to serve as chair.



1           (e) Members of the Puako shore waters study group shall  
2 not be compensated but shall be reimbursed for expenses,  
3 including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of  
4 their duties by the department of health.

5           (f) No member shall be made subject to chapter 84, Hawaii  
6 Revised Statutes, solely because of that member's participation  
7 as a member of the Puako shore waters study group.

8           (g) The Puako shore waters study group shall submit a  
9 report of its findings and recommendations, including any  
10 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty  
11 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2019.

12           (h) The Puako shore waters study group shall cease to  
13 exist on January 1, 2019.

14           SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2118.
