A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RENTAL HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 127, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, 2 established a temporary special action team on affordable rental 3 housing to make short- and long-term policy recommendations to 4 increase the supply of rental housing. The Act also established 5 performance measures and timelines for specific income groups. 6 One of the income groups the special action team focuses on 7 is the extremely low-income population, which consists of 8 families with incomes at or below thirty per cent of the area 9 median income. Of the nearly 57,500 affordable housing units needed across all income levels, fifteen thousand five hundred 10 11 units are needed by extremely low-income households. Extremely 12 low-income households, therefore, account for almost twenty-13 seven per cent of the total need for affordable housing. 14 The legislature finds that developing housing for extremely 15 low-income households poses a significant challenge which 16 requires the concentrated attention of the special action team **17** and state government at the highest level.

3	SECT	ION 3. Act 127, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, section
4	7, is ame	nded by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
5	" (b)	To comply with subsection (a), the special action
6	team shall	l recommend short- and long-term actions to:
7	(1)	Increase the supply of rental housing affordable for
8		[low-] extremely low-income, very low income, low-
9		income, and moderate-income families;
10	(2)	Increase the supply of rental housing for the
11		remainder of the resident population;
12	(3)	Target rental housing development in transit-oriented
13		development areas as a top priority;
14	(4)	Preserve the existing rental housing stock;
15	(5)	Enhance the attractiveness of and market for rental
16		housing relative to fee simple housing; and
17	(6)	Mitigate community concerns over the development of
18		nearby rental housing projects, particularly
19		affordable public or private rental housing projects
20		for extremely low-income, very low income, and low-
21		income families and individuals."

- 1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$10,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
- 4 administration and operation of the special action team on
- 5 rental housing.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 7 planning for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 11 provided that section 4 shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
