A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATEWIDE TRAFFIC CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that traffic lights are
- 2 malfunctioning with increased frequency due to power outages and
- 3 weather incidents. The legislature further finds that there is
- 4 confusion among drivers on how to behave in those situations.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to define for drivers that
- 6 following the right-of-way guidelines for four-way stop
- 7 intersections is the correct course of action to take in
- 8 intersections with malfunctioning traffic-control signals.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 11 and to read as follows:
- 12 "§291C- Inoperative signals. (a) The driver of any
- 13 vehicle approaching an intersection that has inoperative
- 14 traffic-control signals shall stop at the intersection, and may
- 15 proceed with caution when it is safe to do so.
- 16 (b) When two or more vehicles approach or enter an
- 17 intersection from different highways at approximately the same



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- 1 time, and the intersection has inoperative traffic-control
- 2 signals, the drivers shall be subject to the right-of-way code
- 3 as provided in section 291C-61."
- 4 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
