

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STUDENT PRIVACY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to subpart H of part II to be
- 3 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 4 "§302A- Penalties; civil action. (a) Any operator
- 5 that violates this subpart shall be subject to penalties of not
- 6 more than \$2,500 for each violation. Except as otherwise
- 7 provided in subsection (e), the attorney general or the
- 8 executive director of the office of consumer protection may
- 9 bring an action pursuant to this section.
- 10 (b) In addition to any penalty provided for in subsection
- 11 (a), any operator that violates this subpart shall be liable to
- 12 the injured party in an amount equal to the sum of any actual
- 13 damages sustained by the injured party as a result of the
- 14 violation.
- 15 (c) The penalties provided in this section shall be
- 16 cumulative to the remedies or penalties available under all
- 17 other laws of this State.

Ţ	(d) The court in any action brought under this section may
2	award reasonable attorneys' fees to the prevailing party.
3	(e) No action under this section may be brought against a
4	government agency."
5	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
