A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
- 3 designated and to read as follows:
- 4 "S11-A Automatic registration. (a) Notwithstanding any
- 5 law to the contrary, an affidavit on an application for voter
- 6 registration shall be a part of the application associated with
- 7 the issuance of a driver's license, provisional license, or
- 8 instructional permit under section 286-109 and an identification
- 9 card under section 286-301.
- (b) Applications for a driver's license, provisional
- 11 license, or instructional permit or an identification card shall
- 12 not be processed until the applicant either clearly indicates on
- 13 the application that the applicant declines to register to vote
- 14 or completes the portion of the application related to voter
- 15 registration. Each application shall include a space to request
- 16 a permanent absentee ballot.

1	(c) The examiner of drivers of each county shall transmit
2	the completed voter registration information to the clerk of the
3	county in which the applicant resides. Upon receipt of the
4	completed voter registration application transmitted from the
5	examiner of drivers, the county clerk shall review and either
6	approve or reject the voter registration application in
7	accordance with this part; provided that approved voter
8	registration applications received from the examiner of drivers
9	pursuant to this section shall be treated as having a valid
10	signature for purposes of section 11-15(c) whether transmitted
11	electronically or by facsimile transmission. Upon approval of
12	the voter registration application, the clerk shall proceed to
13	number the application and register the name of the voter in the
14	general county register as provided in section 11-15."
15	SECTION 2. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended by adding a new section to part VI to be appropriately
17	designated and to read as follows:
18	" <u>\$286-A</u> Voter registration. (a) If a qualified applicant
19	for a motor vehicle driver's license, provisional license, or
20	instructional permit opts to register to vote when applying for
21	a driver's license provisional license or instructional

- 1 permit, the voter registration information shall automatically
- 2 be transmitted to the clerk of the appropriate county upon
- 3 completion of an application for a driver's license, provisional
- 4 license, or instructional permit as required in section 11-A.
- 5 (b) Every qualified applicant who opts to register to vote
- 6 pursuant to the process established under subsection (a) and
- 7 section 11-A shall be required to authorize the examiner of
- 8 drivers to collect and transmit the necessary personal
- 9 information required for registering the qualified applicant
- 10 with the county clerk. The examiner of drivers shall notify all
- 11 qualified applicants who opt to vote pursuant to the process
- 12 established under subsection (a) and section 11-A that, by
- 13 opting to register to vote and submitting an application for a
- 14 driver's license, provisional license, or instructional permit,
- 15 the qualified applicant is consenting to the automatic
- 16 application to vote with the county clerk.
- 17 (c) For the purposes of this section, "qualified
- 18 applicant" means a person who qualifies to register as a voter
- 19 pursuant to section 11-15."

1	SECTION 3. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part XVI to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§286-B Voter registration. (a) If a qualified applicant
5	for a new, renewal, or duplicate identification card opts to
6	register to vote when applying for a new, renewal, or duplicate
7	identification card, the voter registration information shall
8	automatically be transmitted to the clerk of the appropriate
9	county upon completion of an application for an identification
10	card as required by section 11-A.
11	(b) Every qualified applicant who opts to register to vote
12	pursuant to the process established under subsection (a) and
13	section 11-A shall be required to authorize the examiner of
14	drivers to collect and transmit the necessary personal
15	information required for registering the qualified applicant
16	with the county clerk. The examiner of drivers shall notify all
17	qualified applicants who opt to register to vote pursuant to the
18	process established under subsection (a) and section 11-A that,
19	by opting to register to vote, and by submitting an application
20	for a new, renewal, or duplicate identification card, the

- 1 qualified applicant is consenting to the automatic application
- 2 to vote with the county clerk.
- 3 (c) For the purposes of this section, "qualified
- 4 applicant" means a person who qualifies to register as a voter
- 5 pursuant to section 11-15."
- 6 SECTION 4. Section 11-15.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 8 "(e) The online application system may require additional
- 9 information from applicants, such as security questions to
- 10 authenticate any future voter registration transactions by the
- 11 applicant. The system shall provide a voter, who was registered
- pursuant to section 11-A, the means to verify the voter's
- 13 registration information, update relevant information, and
- 14 withdraw the voter's registration."
- 15 SECTION 5. Section 286-108, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) Except as provided in section 286-107.5(a), the
- 18 examiner of drivers shall examine every applicant for a driver's
- 19 license, except as otherwise provided in this part. The
- 20 examination shall include a test of:

1	(1)	The applicant's eyesight and any further physical
2		examination that the examiner of drivers finds
3		necessary to determine the applicant's fitness to
4		operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways;
5	(2)	The applicant's ability to understand highway signs
6		regulating, warning, and directing traffic;
7	(3)	The applicant's knowledge of the rules of the road
8		based on the traffic laws of the State and the traffic
9		ordinances of the county where the applicant resides
10		or intends to operate a motor vehicle; provided that
11		the examination shall specifically test the
12		applicant's knowledge of the provisions of section
13		291C-121.5 and section 291C-137; and
14	(4)	The actual demonstration of ability to exercise
15		ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a
16		motor vehicle.
17	The exami	nations shall be appropriate to the operation of the
18	category	of motor vehicle for which the applicant seeks to be
19	licensed	and shall be conducted as required by the director.
20	The	examiner of drivers shall require every applicant to
21	comply wi	th section 286-102.5.

- 2 than a commercial driver's license upon conditions imposed by

- 4 and any other conditions as may be imposed by the court, if one
- 5 or more of the following conditions are met:
- 6 (1) The applicant is gainfully employed in a position that
- 7 requires driving and will be discharged if the
- 8 applicant is unable to drive; or
- 9 (2) The applicant has no access to alternative
- transportation and therefore must drive to work;
- 11 provided further that if the applicant has failed to comply in
- 12 full with orders of the district court of more than one circuit,
- 13 the applicant shall obtain the approval of the district court of
- 14 each circuit in which the applicant has an outstanding court
- 15 order before a driver's license or instruction permit may be
- 16 issued or renewed under this subsection.
- 17 A driver's license or instruction permit issued or renewed
- 18 under this subsection shall be subject to immediate suspension
- 19 by the court upon the applicant's failure to remain in full
- 20 compliance with all conditions imposed by the court for the
- 21 issuance or renewal of the driver's license or instruction

- 2 restriction upon a driver's license or instruction permit issued
- 3 or renewed under this subsection. Proof of financial
- 4 responsibility under section 287-20 shall not apply to the

- 7 (d) An application for a driver's license shall include
- 8 the information required under section 11-A."
- 9 SECTION 7. Section 286-301, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- "[+] §286-301[+] Issuance of identification card or
- 12 temporary card. (a) To obtain an identification card from the
- 13 examiner of drivers, an individual shall complete an application
- 14 pursuant to section 286-303.
- 15 (b) The examiner of drivers, upon receipt of the
- 16 application by any individual who is a resident or a temporary
- 17 resident of this State, shall issue an identification card to
- 18 that individual upon receipt of any appropriate fee established
- 19 pursuant to section 286-309.

- 1 (c) The identification card shall be similar in size,
- 2 shape, and design to a driver's license, but shall not entitle
- 3 the individual to whom it is issued to operate a motor vehicle.
- 4 (d) The issuance of an identification card pursuant to
- 5 this section shall not place upon the State of Hawaii or any
- 6 agency any liability for the misuse or the acceptance of the
- 7 identification card as valid identification, which shall be left
- 8 entirely to the discretion of any individual to whom such card
- 9 is presented.
- 10 (e) An application for an identification card from the
- 11 examiner of drivers shall include the information required under
- 12 section 11-A."
- 13 SECTION 8. Section 286-311, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as
- 15 follows:
- 16 "[+] §286-311[+] Custody and use of records; confidential
- 17 information. (a) [All] Except for purposes of sections 286-A,
- 18 286-B, 286-109, and 286-301, information and records acquired by
- 19 the examiner of drivers under this part shall be confidential.
- 20 All information and records shall be maintained in an
- 21 appropriate form and in an appropriate office in the custody and



- 1 under the control of the examiner. The information shall be
- 2 available only to authorized individuals under such restrictions
- 3 as the director shall prescribe. The examiner may dispose of
- 4 any application or identification card, or information or record
- 5 relating to the application or identification card, which does
- 6 not include a social security number, without regard to chapter
- 7 94, whenever, in the examiner's discretion, retention of the
- 8 information or record is no longer required or practicable."
- 9 SECTION 9. In codifying the new sections added by sections
- 10 1, 2, and 3 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall
- 11 substitute appropriate section numbers for the letters used in
- 12 designating the new sections in this Act.
- 13 SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
