A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii community
- 2 college agriculture program prepares students for employment in
- 3 government service as well as the agribusiness, horticulture,
- 4 livestock, flowers and foliage, landscaping, macadamia nut,
- 5 papaya, and coffee industries.
- 6 The legislature also finds that Hawaii community college
- 7 has a cooperative relationship with the University of Hawaii at
- 8 Hilo to use approximately one acre of land at the university's
- 9 agricultural farm. This agricultural farm serves as a live
- 10 instructional laboratory for experiential learning. In
- 11 addition, the Hawaii community college agriculture program
- 12 collaborates with the college's culinary arts program in a
- 13 robust farm-to-table effort.
- 14 Furthermore, fruits and vegetables grown at the University
- 15 of Hawaii at Hilo's agricultural farm are served by the
- 16 college's culinary arts program through on-campus dining
- 17 facilities. In turn, students in the culinary arts program

- 1 spend time on the agricultural farm learning where raw foods
- 2 originate from and what is required to bring these foods to the
- 3 kitchen.
- 4 Currently, production at the University of Hawaii at Hilo's
- 5 agricultural farm is unable to meet demand. The legislature
- 6 believes that the island of Hawaii has the potential to be a
- 7 strong agricultural contributor to the State, and that it is
- 8 important to invest more fully in student agricultural learning
- 9 opportunities. In addition to other potential agriculture
- 10 benefits, the island of Hawaii offers nutrient rich soil, a
- 11 tropical climate, and an abundance of affordable land.
- 12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for
- 13 the study of existing agriculture programs as well as new
- 14 agriculture opportunities on the island of Hawaii in order to
- 15 develop a holistic approach to the growth of agriculture and
- 16 agricultural learning opportunities on the island of Hawaii.
- 17 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 19 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
- 20 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 21 year 2018-2019 for the Hawaii community college and University

1	of Hawaii at Hilo, in collaboration with the Department of
2	Agriculture and the Agribusiness Development Corporation, to
3	study:
4	(1) Areas in which the agriculture programs at Hawaii

19	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
