A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TAXATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1 | SECTION 1. The legislature finds that according to the |

| 3 | of \$1,200,000,000 per month. The aviation industry is importan |
| 4 | for inter-island travel for tourism, medical needs, and inter- |
| 5 | island commerce. The State's economy is highly dependent on |
| 6 | tourism and the ability to travel between islands. There is a |
| 7 | proliferation of helicopter use in the State for travel, |
| 8 | recreational, and medical needs. However, only traditional |
| 9 | aircrafts are afforded certain tax exemptions. Due to changes |
| 10 | in the industry and travel options, taxes levied on aviation |
| 11 | businesses need to be updated to promote inter-island travel |
| 12 | options for visitors and residents, and the interests of the |
| 13 | State. |

The purpose of this Act is to create equity among the types
of available aircrafts by exempting helicopters from the general
excise tax.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 237-24.9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending the definition of "aircraft" in subsection
- 3 (b) to read as follows:
- ""Aircraft" means any craft or artificial contrivance of 4
- 5 whatever description engaged in intrastate, interstate, or
- 6 international scheduled commercial use as defined in chapter
- 263, that operates with two or more jet engines [-], or a 7
- 8 helicopter."
- SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 9
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 11 SECTION 4.
