A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the parking program 1 for persons with disabilities was initiated to ensure that 2 people with a disability are provided parking permits for 3 accessible parking. As of June 30, 2016, the Disability and 4 Communication Access Board reports that there are over 106,294 5 people who possess a valid permit, including over 101,000 long 6 term placards. With such a high number of disabled parking 7 placards in use, abuse of the placards is becoming more 8 prevalent. Successful enforcement requires that the disabled 9 parking program law be strengthened. 10 The purpose of this Act is to reduce the abuse of disabled 11 parking placards by: 12 13 (1)
- 13 (1) Requiring disabled parking placards to include a

 14 photograph of the person to whom the placard is issued

 15 and prominently display the expiration date of the

 16 placard; and

1	(2) Establishing a penalty for using a disabled parking		
2	placard after the death of the person to whom the		
3	placard was issued.		
4	SECTION 2. Section 291-51.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
5	amended to read as follows:		
6	"§291-51.6 Issuance of temporary removable windshield		
7	placards[-]; photograph; expiration. (a) The issuing agency		
8	shall issue one temporary removable windshield placard to each		
9	applicant who requests and presents a certificate of disability		
10	that verifies the duration of the applicant's disability in		
11	monthly increments, which shall not exceed six months, and upor		
12	payment of a fee to the issuing agency. Upon request of an		
13	applicant who was previously issued one temporary removable		
14	windshield placard, a second temporary removable windshield		
15	placard shall be issued to that applicant upon verification of		
16	the applicant's disability.		
17	(b) A temporary removable windshield placard shall bear:		
18	(1) A photograph of the person to whom the placard is		
19	issued; and		
20	(2) The expiration date of the placard, which shall be		
21	prominently displayed."		

1	SECTION 3. Section 291-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"§291-52 Issuance of removable windshield placard[+];		
4	<pre>photograph; expiration. (a) The issuing agency shall issue one</pre>		
5	removable windshield placard to each applicant who presents a		
6	certificate of disability that verifies that the applicant's		
7	disability is expected to last for at least six years. The		
8	removable windshield placard shall expire six years after the		
9	date of its issuance.		
10	(b) A removable windshield placard shall bear:		
11	(1) A photograph of the person to whom the placard is		
12	issued; and		
13	(2) The expiration date of the placard, which shall be		
14	prominently displayed."		
15	SECTION 4. Section 291-52.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
16	amended to read as follows:		
17	"§291-52.6 Replacement of a removable windshield placard		
18	or identification card[+]; photograph; expiration. (a) A		
19	removable windshield placard, temporary removable windshield		
20	placard, or identification card shall be replaced upon:		

1	(1)	Submittal to the issuing agency of a completed
2		application for a removable windshield placard,
3		temporary removable windshield placard, or
4		identification card to the issuing agency; and
5	(2)	Payment of a fee.
6	(b)	A replacement removable windshield placard shall bear:
7	(1)	A photograph of the person to whom the placard is
8		issued; and
9	(2)	The expiration date of the placard, which shall be
10		prominently displayed."
11	SECT	ION 5. Section 291-57, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended t	o read as follows:
13	" §29	1-57 Parking spaces reserved for persons with
14	disabilit	ies; misuse of placard; penalties. (a) Any person who
15	uses a pa	rking space reserved for persons with disabilities and
16	who:	
17	(1)	Fails to properly display a removable windshield
18		placard, a temporary removable windshield placard, or
19		special license plates;

1	(2)	Displays an invalid removable windshield placard, an
2		invalid temporary removable windshield placard, or
3		invalid special license plates;
4	(3)	Uses a removable windshield placard, a temporary
5		removable windshield placard, or special license plate
6		that was not issued to that person or to any
7		passengers occupying the vehicle that is in the
8		parking space; or
9	(4)	With or without a removable windshield placard, a
10		temporary removable windshield placard, or special
11		license plates:
12		(A) Parks in an access aisle; or
13		(B) Obstructs the ingress or egress to a parking
14		space reserved for a person with a disability[\dagger].
15	shall be	guilty of a traffic infraction under chapter 291D and
16	shall be	fined not less than \$250 nor more than \$500 and pay any
17	costs inc	curred by the court related to assessing the fine;
18	provided	that a person with a disability who has been issued a
19	valid pla	acard or special license plate that is currently in
20	effect, a	and who has failed to display the placard or license
21	nlate whi	le parking in a space reserved for persons with

- 1 disabilities, shall pay a fine of not less than \$25 nor more
- 2 than \$100 and any costs incurred by the court related to
- 3 assessing the fine.
- 4 (b) Any person who uses a temporary removable windshield
- 5 placard, removable windshield placard, or replacement removable
- 6 windshield placard, after the death of the person to whom the
- 7 placard was issued, shall be fined \$.
- 8 [\(\frac{\text{(b)}}{\text{c}}\)] (c) Any person who uses a parking space reserved for
- 9 persons with disabilities and refuses or fails to present an
- 10 identification card issued under this chapter or the rules
- 11 adopted thereunder to an enforcement officer upon request shall
- 12 be quilty of a traffic infraction under chapter 291D and shall
- 13 be fined not less than \$250 nor more than \$500.
- 14 [(c)] (d) Any citation issued under this chapter may be
- 15 mailed to the violator pursuant to section 291C-165(b)."
- 16 SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 17 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 18 begun before its effective date.
- 19 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
