### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The department of health developmental SECTION 1. disabilities division is the operating agency for the Hawaii 2 3 medicaid section 1915(c) Home and Community-Based Services for 4 People with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities waiver. 5 The department of health operates the waiver pursuant to a 6 memorandum of agreement with the department of human services, which is the state medicaid agency supervising the 7 8 administration of the waiver. Therefore, the department of 9 health can claim allowable medicaid federal financial 10 participation for the proper and necessary costs incurred by the 11 department in administering the waiver. Administrative claiming 12 has become increasingly important to defray the rising costs to 13 states for administration of medicaid programs. To date, the 14 department of health has conducted minimal administrative 15 claiming, and without a special fund to deposit and use 16 administrative federal financial participation for operating the 17 medicaid section 1915(c) Home and Community-Based Services for

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People with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities waiver,
the department will lack a fund to ensure the proper and
efficient administration of the waiver, and the growing federal
requirements for community integration, quality and
accountability.

The requirements of operating the waiver are specified in 6 7 the State's waiver application approved by the federal Centers 8 for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Through the delegated 9 functions, the department must assure the health and welfare of 10 waiver participants, coordinate services, and ensure the service 11 quality. Specific requirements for the operating authority 12 include completing initial intake for new waiver applicants, 13 completing annual re-determinations of level of care for 14 continued eligibility, performing fiscal oversight to ensure 15 that waiver enrollment and expenditures are managed against 16 federally approved limits, implementing person-centered planning 17 processes, developing and monitoring participant individualized 18 service plans, pre-authorizing waiver services, managing 19 utilization, enrolling qualified providers and provider 20 monitoring, establishing a statewide rate methodology, 21 developing policies and procedures for operating the waiver

2	implementing quality assurance and improvement activities for	
3	required performance measures. The department is contracting to	
4	develop a new information technology system to assist case	
5	managers manage information and provide analytics. Many of the	
6	activities performed by department staff or contracted entities	
7	can be claimed as administrative costs.	
8	SECTION 2. Chapter 333F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
9	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
10	and to read as follows:

All 2 officers of the State and other persons having power to allocate 3 or disburse any special funds shall cooperate with the director 4 in effecting these transfers. To determine the proper revenue 5 base upon which the central service assessment is to be 6 calculated, the director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 7 91 for the purpose of suspending or limiting the application of 8 the central service assessment of any fund. No later than 9 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session of 10 the legislature, the director shall report all central service 11 assessments made during the preceding fiscal year." 7	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
8	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
9	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for
10	deposit into the intellectual and developmental disabilities
11	medicaid waiver administrative claiming special fund.
12	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the intellectual
13	and developmental disabilities medicaid waiver administrative
14	claiming special fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as
15	may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to be used in support
16	of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
17	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
18	health for the purposes of this Act.
19	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
21	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
