
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The department of health developmental
2 disabilities division is the operating agency for the Hawaii
3 medicaid Home and Community-Based Services for People with
4 Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities waiver pursuant to
5 section 1915(c) of the Social Security Act. The department of
6 health operates the waiver pursuant to a memorandum of agreement
7 with the department of human services, which is the state
8 medicaid agency supervising the administration of the waiver.
9 Therefore, the department of health can claim allowable medicaid
10 federal financial participation for the proper and necessary
11 costs incurred by the department in administering the waiver.
12 Administrative claiming has become increasingly important to
13 defray the rising costs to states for administration of medicaid
14 programs. To date, the department of health has conducted
15 minimal administrative claiming, and without a special fund to
16 deposit and use administrative federal financial participation
17 for operating the medicaid section 1915(c) Home and Community-



1 Based Services for People with Intellectual and Developmental
2 Disabilities waiver, the department will lack a fund to ensure
3 the proper and efficient administration of the waiver and the
4 growing federal requirements for community integration, quality,
5 and accountability.

6 The requirements of operating the waiver are specified in
7 the State's waiver application approved by the federal Centers
8 for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Through the delegated
9 functions, the department must ensure the health and welfare of
10 waiver participants, coordinate services, and ensure service
11 quality. Specific requirements for the operating authority
12 include completing initial intake for new waiver applicants,
13 completing annual re-determinations of level of care for
14 continued eligibility, performing fiscal oversight to ensure
15 that waiver enrollment and expenditures are managed against
16 federally approved limits, implementing person-centered planning
17 processes, developing and monitoring participant individualized
18 service plans, pre-authorizing waiver services, managing
19 utilization, enrolling qualified providers and provider
20 monitoring, establishing a statewide rate methodology,
21 developing policies and procedures for operating the waiver



1 subject to department of human services approval, and
2 implementing quality assurance and improvement activities for
3 required performance measures. The department is contracting to
4 develop a new information technology system to assist case
5 managers in managing information and providing analytics. Many
6 of the activities performed by department staff or contracted
7 entities can be claimed as administrative costs.

8 SECTION 2. Chapter 333F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
10 and to read as follows:

11 "§333F- Intellectual and developmental disabilities
12 medicaid waiver administrative claiming special fund. (a)

13 There is established in the treasury of the State the
14 intellectual and developmental disabilities medicaid waiver
15 administrative claiming special fund, into which shall be
16 deposited:

17 (1) All revenues from medicaid administrative claiming
18 designated for the department that are allowable for
19 operating the Hawaii home and community-based services
20 for people with intellectual and developmental



- 1 disabilities waiver pursuant to section 1915(c) of the
2 Social Security Act;
- 3 (2) Appropriations made by the legislature to the fund;
4 (3) Other grants and gifts made to the fund; and
5 (4) Any income and capital gains earned by the fund.
- 6 (b) Moneys in the intellectual and developmental
7 disabilities medicaid waiver administrative claiming special
8 fund shall be used by the department for the following purposes:
- 9 (1) Payment for fiscal management services of the Hawaii
10 home and community-based services for people with
11 intellectual and developmental disabilities waiver
12 pursuant to section 1915(c) of the Social Security
13 Act;
- 14 (2) Training of staff; waiver providers; waiver
15 participants, family members of waiver participants,
16 legal representatives of waiver participants; and
17 community stakeholders;
- 18 (3) Quality management activities for operating the Hawaii
19 home and community-based services for people with
20 intellectual and developmental disabilities waiver



1 pursuant to section 1915(c) of the Social Security
2 Act;
3 (4) Ongoing operations and maintenance of the information
4 technology system;
5 (5) Conducting rate methodology studies to define rates
6 for the Hawaii home and community-based services for
7 people with intellectual and developmental
8 disabilities waiver pursuant to section 1915(c) of the
9 Social Security Act; and
10 (6) Assessment services for determining each participant's
11 level of support needs.
12 (c) The department shall submit to the legislature no
13 later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
14 session a report that provides an accounting of the receipts of
15 and expenditures from the intellectual and developmental
16 disabilities medicaid waiver administrative claiming special
17 fund."

18 SECTION 3. Section 36-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

20 "(a) Except as provided in this section, and
21 notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, from time to



1 time, the director of finance, for the purpose of defraying the
2 prorated estimate of central service expenses of government in
3 relation to all special funds, except the:

1 (36) Intellectual and developmental disabilities medicaid
2 waiver administrative claiming special fund under
3 section 333F- ,
4 shall deduct five per cent of all receipts of all other special
5 funds, which deduction shall be transferred to the general fund
6 of the State and become general realizations of the State. All
7 officers of the State and other persons having power to allocate
8 or disburse any special funds shall cooperate with the director
9 in effecting these transfers. To determine the proper revenue
10 base upon which the central service assessment is to be
11 calculated, the director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
12 91 for the purpose of suspending or limiting the application of
13 the central service assessment of any fund. No later than
14 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session of
15 the legislature, the director shall report all central service
16 assessments made during the preceding fiscal year."

17 SECTION 4. Section 36-30, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

19 "(a) Each special fund, except the:

10 shall be responsible for its pro rata share of the
11 administrative expenses incurred by the department responsible
12 for the operations supported by the special fund concerned."

13 SECTION 5. (a) The state council on developmental
14 disabilities shall establish a working group to examine and
15 evaluate the application process of the Hawaii medicaid section
16 1915(c) home and community-based services for people with
17 intellectual and developmental disabilities waiver and existing
18 services provided by the developmental disabilities division.

19 (b) The members of the working group shall consist of:



- 1 (1) The administrator of the developmental disabilities
2 division of the department of health or the
3 administrator's designee;
- 4 (2) The executive administrator of the state council on
5 developmental disabilities or the executive
6 administrator's designee;
- 7 (3) The executive director of the Hawaii Disability Rights
8 Center or the executive director's designee;
- 9 (4) The chair of the senate committee on human services or
10 the chair's designee;
- 11 (5) The chair of the senate committee on commerce,
12 consumer protection, and health or the chair's
13 designee;
- 14 (6) The chair of the house of representatives committee on
15 health and human services or the chair's designee;
- 16 (7) individuals who are parents or guardians of
17 children with developmental disabilities designated by
18 the administrator of the developmental disabilities
19 division; and



1 (8) Any individual the executive administrator of the
2 state council on developmental disabilities deems
3 necessary to be a member of the working group.

4 The members of the working group shall designate a chairperson
5 from among themselves.

6 (c) The members of the working group shall serve without
7 compensation and without reimbursement for expenses; provided
8 that the individuals designated pursuant to subsection (b)(7)
9 may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred in their
10 duties as members of the working group.

11 (d) The working group shall submit a report to the
12 legislature of its findings and recommendations, including any
13 proposed legislation, no later than twenty days prior to the
14 convening of the regular session of 2019.

15 (e) The working group shall cease to exist on June 30,
16 2019.

17 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
19 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for
20 deposit into the intellectual and developmental disabilities
21 medicaid waiver administrative claiming special fund.



1 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the intellectual
2 and developmental disabilities medicaid waiver administrative
3 claiming special fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to be used in support
5 of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
7 health for the purposes of this Act.

8 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

10 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Medicaid Waiver

Description:

Creates the intellectual and developmental disabilities medicaid waiver administrative claiming special fund into which federal moneys may be deposited from Department of Health's participation in the waiver program under section 1915(c) of the Social Security Act. Establishes a working group to evaluate and examine the existing application process for the section 1915(c) waiver and other services by the developmental disabilities division of the Department of Health. Requires the working group to report to the Legislature prior to the convening of the regular session of 2019. Makes an appropriation. Effective 7/1/3000. (SD2)
