A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the affordable 2 housing crisis in Hawaii extends to the lack of affordable 3 rentals, particularly in high visitor traffic areas. This lack 4 of affordable rentals hurts the quality of service, diminishes 5 Hawaii's appeal in the visitor industry, and stresses the 6 State's infrastructure, due to increased traffic. 7 The legislature also finds the lack of affordable rental 8 homes in these areas are due to the high costs of property 9 ownership, which encourages many landlords to enter into 10 interval or short-term rentals rather than workforce-eligible
 - The legislature further finds that, in order to create more immediate affordable housing rentals for workforce-eligible people within the areas of the most need, an economic incentive would stimulate private landowner participation.
- 16 The legislature believes that a tax credit program would
 17 provide immediate needed rental housing for local working

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rentals.

- 1 families that would not only bolster the visitor industry, but
- 2 ease congestion and create more disposable income, while
- 3 eliminating the need for support services for families who must
- 4 dedicate more of their income to their rent.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to establish an income tax
- 6 credit for taxpayers who rent housing to certain low-income
- 7 tenants or eligible organizations that serve homeless or low-
- 8 income families or individuals.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 235, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 11 and to read as follows:
- 12 "§235- Affordable rental housing; income tax credit.
- 13 (a) There shall be allowed to each taxpayer subject to the tax
- 14 imposed under this chapter, a credit that shall be deductible
- 15 from the taxpayer's net income tax liability, if any, imposed by
- 16 this chapter for the taxable year in which the credit is
- 17 properly claimed. The amount of the tax credit shall be equal
- 18 to \$ per housing unit that the taxpayer rents to an
- 19 eligible tenant.
- (b) In the case of a partnership, S corporation, estate,
- 21 or trust, the tax credit allowable is for every housing unit



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1	rented to an eligible tenant by the entity. The cost upon which
2	the tax credit is computed shall be determined at the entity
3	level. Distribution and share of credit shall be determined by
4	rule.
5	(c) The director of taxation:
6	(1) Shall prepare any forms that may be necessary to claim
7	a tax credit under this section;
8	(2) May require the taxpayer to furnish reasonable
9	information to ascertain the validity of the claim for
10	credit made under this section; and
11	(3) May adopt rules under chapter 91 necessary to
12	effectuate the purposes of this section.
13	(d) If the tax credit under this section exceeds the
14	taxpayer's income tax liability, the excess of the credit over
15	liability may be used as a credit against the taxpayer's income
16	tax liability in subsequent years until exhausted. All claims
17	for the tax credit under this section, including amended claims,
18	shall be filed on or before the end of the twelfth month
19	following the close of the taxable year for which the credit may
20	be claimed. Failure to comply with the foregoing provision
21	shall constitute a waiver of the right to claim the credit.

1	(e) For the purposes of this section, "eligible tenant"	
2	means:	
3	(1) A family or an individual:	
4	(A) Whose income from all sources is less than one	
5	hundred per cent of the area median income as	
6	determined by the United States Department of	
7	Housing and Urban Development; and	
8	(B) Who has filed state income tax returns for the	
9	past ten consecutive taxable years; or	
10	(2) An eligible organization that serves homeless or low	w –
11	income families or individuals."	
12	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.	
13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon a date to be	
14	determined and shall apply to taxable years beginning after	
15	December 31, 2017.
