A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The legislature finds that housing first
2	programs a	are a collaborative effort between the department of
3	human ser	vices and the United States Department of Housing and
4	Urban Dev	elopment that provides housing and support services for
5	chronically homeless individuals, including those who have an	
6	addiction	or mental illness, or both. The principles of housing
7	first pro	grams include:
8	(1)	Moving chronically homeless individuals into housing
9		directly from streets and the shelters without a
10		precondition of accepting or complying with treatment;
11	(2)	Providing robust support services for program
12		participants that are predicated on assertive
13		engagement rather than coercion;
14	(3)	Granting chronically homeless individuals priority as
15		program participants in housing first programs;

1	(4) Embracing a harm-reduction approach to addictions		
2	rather than mandating abstinence while supporting		
3	program participant commitments to recovery; and		
4	(5) Providing program participants with leases and tenant		
5	protections as provided by law.		
6	Housing first is a nationally recognized best practice and		
7	has been proven to be an effective approach to helping people		
8	experiencing chronic homelessness get off of the streets in		
9	several cities. In Portland, Oregon, the housing first program		
10	helped reduce the number of chronically homeless people sleeping		
11	outside by seventy per cent. In Los Angeles, California, for		
12	each chronically homeless person placed in housing first, Los		
13	Angeles saved \$80,000 over two years. Similar results in Salt		
14	Lake City, Utah; Denver, Colorado; Quincy, Massachusetts; and		
15	Portland, Maine; show that housing first is effective in		
16	reducing chronic homelessness. Currently, the housing first		
17	program only serves the island of Oahu, despite the needs of		
18	individuals on neighboring islands.		
19	The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the		
20	department of human services to support the State's housing		
21	first programs in assisting the rest of Hawaii's residents		

- 1 outside of Oahu who are chronically homeless and who are often
- 2 the most vulnerable and most difficult to serve.
- 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,000,000 or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
- 6 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 7 2018-2019 for continued implementation of the State's housing
- 8 first program and expansion of the program outside of Oahu to
- 9 assist residents who are chronically homeless.
- 10 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 11 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
