A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PAPAHANAUMOKUAKEA MARINE NATIONAL MONUMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that President Barack
- 2 Obama issued Presidential Proclamation 9478 on August 26, 2016,
- 3 expanding the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument to
- 4 provide critical protections for more than seven thousand marine
- 5 species, including whales and sea turtles listed under the
- 6 Endangered Species Act and the longest-living marine species in
- 7 the world black coral, which have been found to live longer
- 8 than four thousand five hundred years. Additionally, as ocean
- 9 acidification, warming, and other impacts of climate change
- 10 threaten marine ecosystems, expanding the monument will improve
- 11 ocean resilience, help the region's distinct physical and
- 12 biological resources adapt, and create a natural laboratory that
- 13 will allow scientists to monitor and explore the impacts of
- 14 climate change on these fragile ecosystems.
- 15 The expanded monument area also contains resources of great
- 16 historical and cultural significance. The expanded area,
- 17 including the archipelago and its adjacent waters, is considered

- 1 a sacred place for the Native Hawaiian community. It plays a
- 2 significant role in Native Hawaiian creation and settlement
- 3 stories, and is used to practice important activities like
- 4 traditional long-distance voyaging and wayfinding.
- 5 Additionally, within the monument expansion area, there are
- 6 shipwrecks and downed aircraft from the Battle of Midway during
- 7 World War II, a battle that marked a major shift in the progress
- 8 of the war in favor of the Allies.
- The legislature further finds that Proclamation 9478
- 10 directs federal agencies to work together with the State to
- 11 create a joint management plan by August 26, 2019, and adopt
- 12 implementing regulations, as appropriate, that address any
- 13 further specific actions necessary for the proper care and
- 14 management of the monument.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to establish the
- 16 Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument program to coordinate
- 17 and fulfill the State's role and responsibilities in co-managing
- 18 the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument.
- 19 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 20 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 21 as follows:

3	§ -1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to		
4	establish the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument program		
5	to coordinate and fulfill the State's role and responsibilities		
6	in co-managing the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument.		
7	§ -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter:		
8	"Board" means the board of land and natural resources.		
9	"Department" means the department of land and natural		
10	resources.		
11	"Monument" means the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National		
12	Monument as established by Proclamation 8031 of June 15, 2006		
13	(71 Fed. Reg. 36443), as amended by Proclamation 8112 of		
14	February 28, 2007 (72 Fed. Reg. 10029), and as expanded by		
15	Proclamation 9478 of August 26, 2016 (81 Fed. Reg. 60225), under		
16	the authority of the Antiquities Act (title 16 U.S.C. 431).		
17	"Program" means the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National		
18	Monument program.		
19	§ -3 Lead agency. The department is designated as the		
20	lead agency of the State to co-manage the monument in accordance		
21	with Proclamation 8031 of June 15, 2006 (71 Fed. Reg. 36443),		

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- 1 and expanded by Proclamation 9478 of August 26, 2016 (81 Fed.
- 2 Reg. 60225), and the December 8, 2006, memorandum of agreement
- 3 between the department; United States Department of the
- 4 Interior, United States Fish and Wildlife Service; and the
- 5 United States Department of Commerce, National Oceanic and
- 6 Atmospheric Administration. In this role, the department shall
- 7 exercise its stewardship responsibility for managing,
- 8 administering, and exercising control over lands, waters, and
- 9 natural resources within the State's jurisdiction. As the lead
- 10 agency for the State, the department shall also collaborate with
- 11 the office of Hawaiian affairs in the perpetuation of Hawaiian
- 12 cultural resources within the monument, including the customary
- 13 and traditional rights and practices of native Hawaiians
- 14 exercised for subsistence, cultural, and religious purposes
- 15 under section 7 of article XII of the state constitution.
- 16 § -4 Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument program.
- 17 (a) There is established the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National
- 18 Monument program to be placed within the department's division
- 19 of aquatic resources to coordinate and fulfill the State's
- 20 management responsibilities of the monument.
- 21 (b) The program may:

1	(1)	Issue permits as part of the co-trustee monument
2		permit process consistent with applicable state laws,
3		the Proclamation 8031 of June 15, 2006 (71 Fed. Reg.
4		36443), as expanded by Proclamation 9478 of August 26,
5		2016 (81 Fed. Reg. 60225) and title 50 C.F.R. part
6		404;
7	(2)	Provide advice and recommendations to the governor,
8		the department, and other state departments and
9		agencies on any matter relating to the management of
10		the monument;
11	(3)	Solicit and accept grants, donations, and
12		contributions to support the purposes of this chapter;
13		and
14	(4)	Adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to effectuate this
15		chapter.
16	(c)	The department may charge fees that are proportional
17	to the na	ture and complexity of the projects or services
18	performed	by the program, such as the issuance of permits;
19	provided	that:
20	(1)	Fees shall be charged in accordance with a schedule
21		approved by the board;

1	(2)	The proposed fee schedule shall be posted on the	
2		department's website at least forty-five days prior to	
3		the board meeting at which adoption will be	
4		considered;	
5	(3)	The board shall consider and adopt the fee schedule at	
6		a regular meeting after taking public testimony; and	
7	(4)	The setting of fees shall not be subject to chapter	
8		91.	
9	(d)	Except as otherwise provided by law, the board or its	
10	duly authorized representative may impose general administrativ		
11	penalties	for any person violating any provision of any rule	
12	adopted u	nder this chapter, including any term or condition of	
13	any permit issued under this chapter, as provided by section		
14	187A-12.5."		
15	SECT	TON 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that	
16	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were	
17	begun bef	ore its effective date.	
18	SECT	TION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
