A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds that the community SECTION 1. 2 colleges play a vital role in meeting the employment needs of 3 the State. A well-trained and highly qualified work force would 4 also attract additional employers to Hawaii and diversify the 5 local economy. In addition, the countless benefits of higher 6 education include the potential for higher earnings by workers 7 and higher tax, health-care-insurance, and retirement-pension 8 contributions by workers. 9 The legislature also finds that a student's access to 10 higher education should not be impeded by financial concerns.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, part IV, subpart A, subdivision
- 12 1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section
- 13 to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 14 "§304A- Community college tuition waiver. (a) The
- board of regents shall waive the tuition of any person who
- 16 applies for a tuition waiver under this section, provided that
- 17 the following conditions are met:

4		least twelve months prior to the time of applying for
5		the waiver, and has qualified for resident tuition;

8	(4)	The person is admitted to and enrolled full-time in a
9		community college of the University of Hawaii;
10	(5)	The person maintains satisfactory academic progress,
11		as determined by the community college in which the
12		person is enrolled;
13	(6)	The person maintains continuous full-time enrollment
14		at a community college of the University of Hawaii,
15		except for periods of medical or personal leave of
16		absence, as approved by the community college that the
17		person attends;
18	(7)	The person is physically present in the State; and
19	(8)	The person is under the age of twenty-six.
20	(b)	As used in this subsection, an "eligible non-citizen"
21	means a n	erson who is:

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1	(1)	A United States permanent resident who holds a					
2		permanent resident card;					
3	(2)	A conditional permanent resident of the United States;					
4		<u>or</u>					
5	(3)	The holder of an Arrival-Departure Record (I-94) from					
6		the Department of Homeland Security showing any one of					
7		the following designations:					
8		(A) Refugee;					
9		(B) Asylum granted;					
10		(C) Parolee; or					
11		(D) Cuban-Haitian Entrant."					
12	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general					
13	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$20,000,000 or so					
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and						
15	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal						
16	year 2018-2019 to pay for tuition waivers for qualifying						
17	community college students; provided that any portion of the						
18	sums appr	opriated that have not been expended by June 30, 2018,					
19	and June	30, 2019, respectively, shall not lapse and shall be					
20	used for	tuition waivers for students in the University of					
21	Hawaii sy	stem who:					

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1	(1)	Are	not	students	at	community	colleges;	and
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- 2 (2) Otherwise meet the conditions in section 304A- ,
- 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, of section 2 of this Act;
- 4 provided further that any remaining unencumbered balance on June
- 5 30, 2020, shall lapse to the credit of the general fund.
- 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
- 7 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
