

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADDRESSING THE HEALTH UNFUNDED LIABILITY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, according to the
- 2 National Conference of State Legislatures, in 2010, forty-six
- 3 states self-insured or self-funded at least one of their
- 4 employee health care plans. The legislature also finds that, in
- 5 2010, at least twenty states self-funded all of their employee
- 6 health care offerings.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to require the auditor to study
- 8 the feasibility of providing health benefits to state and county
- 9 employees using a self-insured model.
- 10 SECTION 2. The auditor shall study the feasibility of
- 11 providing health benefits to state and county employees using a
- 12 self-insured model.
- 13 The auditor may contract the services of another entity to
- 14 perform any related services that may be required pursuant to
- 15 this Act. Any contract for services executed pursuant to this
- 16 Act shall be exempt from chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

- 1 The auditor shall submit a report of its findings and
- recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 2
- 3 legislature not later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- the regular session of 2018. 4
- SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 5
- revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 6
- much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 for 7
- the purposes of this Act. 8
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the auditor for 9
- 10 the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017. 11
