# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii must
 transition its agriculture industry, once dominated by sugar and
 pineapple, to one that is beneficial for diversified food crops.
 While diversified agriculture has increased, industry experts
 estimate that Hawaii imports approximately eighty-five to ninety
 per cent of the food it consumes.

7 According to a report issued in October 2012 by the office 8 of planning in cooperation with the department of agriculture, 9 entitled "Increased Food Security and Food Self-Sufficiency 10 Strategy: A State Strategic/Functional Plan Prepared in 11 Accordance with HRS Chapter 226 Hawaii State Plan and the Hawaii 12 Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy", replacing just ten 13 per cent of the food that Hawaii currently imports would amount 14 to approximately \$313,000,000, which would remain in the State 15 and generate more than two thousand three hundred jobs. 16 Investing in farmland and irrigation infrastructure will bring

Hawaii closer to becoming self-sufficient, and such local
 investments will benefit local residents.

3 The legislature further finds that Governor Ige set the 4 policy goal of doubling food production by 2020. Issues such as 5 preserving agricultural land, identifying food crops for local 6 production, and improving irrigation and agricultural 7 infrastructure need immediate attention so that doubling food 8 production can become a realistic objective. Additionally, the 9 senate is committed to enacting the seventeen United Nations 10 sustainable development goals as a priority for the regular 11 session of 2018. The second of these goals includes doubling 12 local food production.

13 The purpose of this Act is to take steps toward doubling 14 and identifying food crops for local food production by 15 requiring the department of agriculture, in coordination with 16 the agribusiness development corporation and University of 17 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources, to 18 conduct crop performance testing trials on state agricultural 19 lands of Hawaii's most highly imported food crops.

20 SECTION 2. (a) The department of agriculture, in
21 coordination with the agribusiness development corporation and

the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and
 human resources, shall conduct crop performance testing trials
 on state agricultural land of the top food crops imported
 into the State between 2012 and 2017.

5 (b) The department of agriculture shall submit a report of
6 its findings and recommendations, including any proposed
7 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
8 to the convening of the regular session of 2020.

9 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for
12 crop performance testing trials; provided that the sum
13 appropriated shall not lapse until June 30, 2020.

14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 15 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
