### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTRACTORS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that electrical
- 2 contractors are responsible for managing the technical aspects
- 3 of electrical work. The legislature also finds that electrical
- 4 work may pose hazards related to public and worker safety.
- 5 Therefore, individuals and entities applying to be licensed as
- 6 electrical contractors should demonstrate the necessary level of
- 7 training and knowledge to possess a trade license to perform
- 8 electrical work in accordance with chapter 448E, Hawaii Revised
- 9 Statutes.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to protect the public and
- 11 promote worker safety by requiring electrical contractors to
- 12 possess a trade license to perform electrical work in Hawaii or
- 13 an electrical engineering degree from a duly accredited college.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 444, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 16 and to read as follows:

1	"§444- Licensing of electrical contractors, pole and
2	line contractors, high voltage electrical contractors, and
3	electronic systems contractors; minimum qualifications. (a)
4	Effective July 1, 2017, any person applying for a license as an
5	electrical contractor, pole and line contractor, or high voltage
6	electrical contractor shall possess, at a minimum, a journey
7	worker electrician license pursuant to chapter 448E, or an
8	electrical engineering degree from a duly accredited college.
9	(b) Effective July 1, 2017, any person applying for a
10	license as an electronic systems contractor shall possess, at a
11	minimum, a journey worker specialty electrician license pursuant
12	to chapter 448E, or an electrical engineering degree from a duly
13	accredited college."
14	SECTION 3. Section 444-11.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"§444-11.1 Requirements to maintain license. (a) A
17	licensed contractor shall have and maintain in full force and
18	effect the following:
19	(1) Workers' compensation insurance; unless the licensee
20	is authorized to act as a self-insurer under chapter

1		386 or is excluded from the requirements of chapter
2		386;
3	(2)	Liability insurance from an insurance company or
4		agency for comprehensive personal injury and property
5		damage liability; and
6	(3)	Bond when required by the board, under section 444-
7		16.5.
8	(b)	Failure, refusal, or neglect of any licensed
9	contracto	r to maintain in full force and effect, the applicable
10	workers'	compensation insurance, liability insurance, or bond
11	shall cau	se the automatic forfeiture of the license of the
12	contracto	r effective as of the date of expiration or
13	cancellat	ion of the contractor's workers' compensation
14	insurance	, liability insurance, or bond.
15	(c)	The board shall not restore the forfeited license
16	until sat	isfactory proof of continuous insurance and bond
17	coverages	is submitted to the board as required by this section
18	(d)	Failure to restore a license within sixty days after
19	the date	of forfeiture shall result in the forfeiture of all
20	fees and	shall require the person to apply as a new applicant.

- 1 (e) The board may assess a fee not to exceed \$1,000,
- 2 impose a bond, or restrict the license as a condition for the
- 3 restoration of a license forfeited pursuant to this section.
- 4 (f) A licensee may, within sixty days after receipt of the
- 5 notification of the forfeiture, request an administrative
- 6 hearing to review the forfeiture pursuant to chapter 91.
- 7 (g) Effective July 1, 2017, in addition to the
- 8 requirements set forth in this section, electrical contractors,
- 9 pole and line contractors, high voltage electrical contractors,
- 10 and electronic systems contractors who are licensed under this
- 11 chapter shall meet the requirements of section 444- ."
- 12 SECTION 4. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to
- 13 prohibit a general contractor from performing customary duct or
- 14 conduit work as part of site preparation.
- 15 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
